#### **SUMMARY**

### Synopsis of Senate Conservation Committee Amendment

The Senate Conservation Committee amendment to House Bill 278 makes explicit that the board of trustees for the land grant-merced Town of Atrisco shall not have regulatory jurisdiction over, and the provisions of Chapter 49 Article 1 NMSA 1978 shall not apply to or govern any lands or interests in real property owned by any other person, including a public or private corporation, partnership or limited liability company.

# Synopsis of Original Bill

House Bill 278 proposes to amend Section 49-1-2 NMSA 1978 to require the town of Atrisco land grant-merced to be governed by the provisions of Sections 49-1-1 through 49-1-18 NMSA 1978.

# CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP

HB82 proposes to amend the same section of statute for the purpose of adding the town of Tecolote as a political subdivision of the state.

SB379 is a duplicate of this bill.

SB176 is related to HB278 in that if SB176 becomes law, the Land Grant Council would have the authority to determine if a land grant is a political subdivision of the state.

# WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

If this bill is not enacted the town of Atrisco might still become a political subdivision of the state if SB 176 becomes law.
