### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 352 amends the early voting section of the Election Code. This legislation shortens the early voting period by a week. It states that the period of early voting shall commence on the second Saturday prior to an election, rather than the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday prior to the election.

The effective date of this legislation would be on July 1, 2011.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

According to the Secretary of State's Office, the costs of early voting sites are paid by individual counties. This legislation would decrease the costs associated with maintaining and operating early voting sites and hiring poll workers, but may increase absentee and Election Day voting costs to some extent. This legislation may decrease the amount of manpower and support provided by the Secretary of State's office to county clerks but does not appear to have a significant impact on the Secretary of State's office.

The County Clerks Affiliate noted that the early voting period is much too long and the turnout too low to justify the cost. In a 2010, the per vote cost for early voting in Bernalillo County ran from \$60-80 per early site and in Santa Fe County, the cost was over \$25 per vote at early sites.

# **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

In recent years, many voters have begun to rely upon the convenience of early voting. The SOS notes that instituting a shortened time period, might reduce the percentage of individuals voting early. Approximately 4.5% of early voters vote in the first week; 10.5% in the second week; 32% in the third week and 53% in the final week.

## **AMENDMENTS**

The County Clerks Affiliate suggested eliminating early voting in primary elections.
