SUMMARY

Synopsis of Senate Conservation Committee Amendment

The amendment passed by the Senate Conservation Committee would direct the appropriation to the Local Government Division of the Department of Finance and Administration. It would also allow the appropriation to be expended for other purposes, including the purchase of Liñas or other lands of the grant and restoration of the Ponce de Leon hot springs.

Synopsis of Original Bill

Senate Bill 153 would appropriate \$150,000 from the general fund to the Land Grant Council to provide for a boundary survey of the Liñas area within the Cristobal de la Serna land grant in Taos County.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$150,000 contained in this bill is a non-recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2012 shall revert to the general fund.
