WHEREAS, she also was a member of the house health and government affairs committee and the radioactive and hazardous materials committee; and

WHEREAS, she was a recipient of many awards and recognitions, most notably the "Flor de las Flores" award from the Hispanic round table in 2000; and

WHEREAS, she also received the legislator of the year award from the New Mexico association of counties, the community colleges association support award, the Los Alamos firefighters award, the independent community colleges support award, the association of commerce and industry business star award, the recycle New Mexico legislator of the year award, the
