

HOUSE TAXATION AND REVENUE COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL 191

50TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - SECOND SESSION, 2012

AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF
SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES FROM CERTAIN
FUNDS AND BALANCES; CLARIFYING CONDITIONS FOR THE ISSUANCE OF
BONDS; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF SEVERANCE
TAX BOND PROCEEDS; ESTABLISHING CONDITIONS FOR THE REVERSION OF
UNEXPENDED BALANCES; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; REAUTHORIZING
BALANCES AND CHANGING PURPOSES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--AUTHORIZATIONS--
APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell
severance tax bonds in compliance with the Severance Tax
Bonding Act in an amount not to exceed the total of the amounts
authorized for purposes specified in this act. The state board

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1 of finance shall schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in
2 the most expeditious and economical manner possible upon a
3 finding by the board that the project has been developed
4 sufficiently to justify the issuance and that the project can
5 proceed to contract within a reasonable time. The state board
6 of finance shall further take the appropriate steps necessary
7 to comply with the federal Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as
8 amended. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds are appropriated
9 for the purposes specified in this act.

10 B. The agencies named in this act shall certify to
11 the state board of finance when the money from the proceeds of
12 the severance tax bonds appropriated in this section is needed
13 for the purposes specified in the applicable section of this
14 act. If an agency has not certified the need for severance tax
15 bond proceeds for a particular project, including projects that
16 have been reauthorized, by the end of fiscal year 2014, the
17 authorization for that project is void.

18 C. Before an agency may certify for the need of
19 severance tax bond proceeds, the project must be developed
20 sufficiently so that the agency reasonably expects to:

- 21 (1) incur within six months after the
22 applicable bond proceeds are available for the project a
23 substantial binding obligation to a third party to expend at
24 least five percent of the bond proceeds for the project; and
25 (2) spend at least eighty-five percent of the

1 bond proceeds within three years after the applicable bond
2 proceeds are available for the project.

3 D. Except as otherwise specifically provided by
4 law:

5 (1) the unexpended balance from the proceeds
6 of severance tax bonds appropriated in this act for a project
7 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund no later than
8 the following dates:

9 (a) for a project for which severance
10 tax bond proceeds were appropriated to match federal grants,
11 six months after completion of the project;

12 (b) for a project for which severance
13 tax bond proceeds were appropriated to purchase vehicles,
14 including emergency vehicles and other vehicles that require
15 special equipment; heavy equipment; books; educational
16 technology; or other equipment or furniture that is not related
17 to a more inclusive construction or renovation project, at the
18 end of the fiscal year two years following the fiscal year in
19 which the severance tax bond proceeds were made available for
20 the purchase; and

21 (c) for any other project for which
22 severance tax bonds were appropriated, within six months of
23 completion of the project, but no later than the end of fiscal
24 year 2016; and

25 (2) all remaining balances from the proceeds

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1 of severance tax bonds appropriated for a project in this act
2 shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund three months
3 after the latest reversion date specified for that type of
4 project in Paragraph (1) of this subsection.

5 E. Except for appropriations to the capital program
6 fund, money from severance tax bond proceeds provided pursuant
7 to this act shall not be used to pay indirect project costs.

8 F. Except for a project that was originally funded
9 using a tax-exempt loan or bond issue, a project involving
10 repayment of debt previously incurred shall be funded through
11 the issuance of taxable severance tax bonds with a term that
12 does not extend beyond the fiscal year in which they are
13 issued.

14 G. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
15 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after
16 reserving for unpaid costs and expenses covered by binding
17 written obligations to third parties.

18 SECTION 2. GENERAL FUND AND OTHER FUND APPROPRIATIONS--
19 LIMITATIONS--REVERSIONS.--

20 A. Except as otherwise specifically provided by
21 law:

22 (1) the unexpended balance of an appropriation
23 made in this act from the general fund or other state funds
24 shall revert no later than the following dates:

25 (a) for a project for which an

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1 appropriation was made to match federal grants, six months
2 after completion of the project;

3 (b) for a project for which an
4 appropriation was made to purchase vehicles, including
5 emergency vehicles and other vehicles that require special
6 equipment; heavy equipment; books; educational technology; or
7 other equipment or furniture that is not related to a more
8 inclusive construction or renovation project, at the end of the
9 fiscal year two years following the fiscal year in which the
10 appropriation was made for the purchase; and

11 (c) for any other project for which an
12 appropriation was made, within six months of completion of the
13 project, but no later than the end of fiscal year 2016; and

14 (2) all remaining balances from an
15 appropriation made in this act for a project shall revert three
16 months after the latest reversion date specified for that type
17 of project in Paragraph (1) of this subsection.

18 B. Except for appropriations to the capital program
19 fund, money from appropriations made in this act shall not be
20 used to pay indirect project costs.

21 C. Except as provided in Subsection E of this
22 section, the balance of an appropriation made from the general
23 fund shall revert in the time frame set forth in Subsection A
24 of this section to the capital projects fund.

25 D. Except as provided in Subsection E of this

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1 section, the balance of an appropriation made from other state
2 funds shall revert in the time frame set forth in Subsection A
3 of this section to the originating fund.

4 E. The balance of an appropriation made from the
5 general fund or other state fund to the Indian affairs
6 department or the aging and long-term services department for a
7 project located on lands of an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo
8 shall revert in the time frame set forth in Subsection A of
9 this section to the tribal infrastructure project fund.

10 F. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
11 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after
12 reserving for unpaid costs and expenses covered by binding
13 written obligations to third parties.

14 SECTION 3. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS PROJECT--
15 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
16 of this act, upon certification by the administrative office of
17 the courts that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds,
18 one million dollars (\$1,000,000) is appropriated to the
19 administrative office of the courts for security cameras,
20 furniture, fixtures and other information technology
21 infrastructure for the first judicial district courthouse in
22 Santa Fe in Santa Fe county.

23 SECTION 4. AGING AND LONG-TERM SERVICES DEPARTMENT
24 PROJECTS--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of
25 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the aging and

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1 long-term services department that the need exists for the
2 issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated
3 to the aging and long-term services department for the
4 following purposes:

5 1. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
6 purchase and install or upgrade cabinets at Los Volcanes senior
7 center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

8 2. one hundred ninety-two thousand dollars
9 (\$192,000) to plan, design and construct a long-term care,
10 assisted living and senior center at the Pueblo of Isleta in
11 Bernalillo county;

12 3. one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) to
13 plan, design and prepare a site for a senior center in the
14 Church Rock chapter of the Navajo Nation in McKinley county;

15 4. one million six hundred fifty thousand dollars
16 (\$1,650,000) for ongoing construction and project completion to
17 address health and safety issues and increased costs at the
18 following centers in the following amounts:

19 (a) one hundred fifty thousand dollars
20 (\$150,000) for East Mesa senior center in Dona Ana county;

21 (b) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000)
22 for Chichiltah chapter senior center in the Navajo Nation in
23 McKinley county;

24 (c) three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000)
25 for Iyanbito chapter senior center in the Navajo Nation in

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1 McKinley county;

2 (d) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
3 for Torreon-Star Lake chapter senior center in the Navajo
4 Nation in Sandoval county; and

5 (e) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
6 for Whitehorse Lake chapter senior center in the Navajo Nation
7 in McKinley county;

8 5. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to plan, design,
9 construct and equip improvements to the San Miguel senior
10 center on the San Miguel del Vado land grant in San Miguel
11 county;

12 6. three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000)
13 to design and construct improvements to the parking lot,
14 sidewalks, landscaping and lighting, including removal of
15 asphalt, at the Meadowlark senior center in Rio Rancho in
16 Sandoval county; and

17 7. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to plan,
18 design, construct, purchase, improve and equip the Ken and
19 Patty Adams senior center in Eldorado in Santa Fe county.

20 SECTION 5. CAPITAL PROGRAM FUND PROJECTS--SEVERANCE TAX
21 BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
22 upon certification by the capital program fund that the need
23 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
24 appropriated to the capital program fund for the following
25 purposes:

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1 1. three million four hundred thousand dollars
2 (\$3,400,000) to upgrade the heating, ventilation and air
3 conditioning systems and infrastructure in housing units and
4 support buildings at the central New Mexico correctional
5 facility in Valencia county and the western New Mexico
6 correctional facility in Cibola county;

7 2. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
8 infrastructure improvements and code compliance upgrades at the
9 youth diagnostic and development center campus in Albuquerque
10 in Bernalillo county and the John Paul Taylor center in Las
11 Cruces in Dona Ana county;

12 3. seven hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) to
13 plan, design, renovate, expand, furnish and equip the New
14 Mexico state police district office in Espanola in Rio Arriba
15 county;

16 4. four million seven hundred thousand dollars
17 (\$4,700,000) to construct, furnish and equip additional patient
18 housing units at the New Meadows long-term care facility at the
19 New Mexico behavioral health institute in Las Vegas in San
20 Miguel county and for other patient health and safety
21 improvements at department of health facilities statewide;

22 5. three million dollars (\$3,000,000) to renovate,
23 furnish and equip the dormitories, including upgrading
24 plumbing, electrical and mechanical systems and other
25 infrastructure, at the New Mexico law enforcement academy in

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1 Santa Fe county;

2 6. six million dollars (\$6,000,000) for
3 infrastructure improvements, renovations, furnishing and
4 equipping the Manuel Lujan building in Santa Fe in Santa Fe
5 county;

6 7. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to
7 renovate, repair and equip correctional facilities statewide;

8 8. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
9 infrastructure improvements for health and safety upgrades at
10 department of health facilities statewide;

11 9. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
12 repairs, renovations, deferred maintenance, restoration,
13 infrastructure improvements and construction at state buildings
14 statewide; and

15 10. five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to plan,
16 design, construct, renovate and furnish the human services
17 department drug and substance abuse treatment facility in Los
18 Lunas in Valencia county.

19 SECTION 6. CULTURAL AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT PROJECTS--
20 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
21 of this act, upon certification by the cultural affairs
22 department that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds,
23 the following amounts are appropriated to the cultural affairs
24 department for the following purposes:

25 1. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to

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1 construct a memorial on the grounds of the national Hispanic
2 cultural center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county; and

3 2. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) for
4 repairs, upgrades and renovations to address health and safety
5 deficiencies at state museums and monuments statewide.

6 SECTION 7. COMMISSION FOR DEAF AND HARD-OF-HEARING
7 PERSONS PROJECT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the
8 provisions of Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the
9 commission for deaf and hard-of-hearing persons that the need
10 exists for the issuance of the bonds, two hundred thousand
11 dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated to the commission for deaf
12 and hard-of-hearing persons to purchase land for and plan,
13 design, construct, purchase, improve, renovate, equip and
14 furnish a deaf culture multipurpose center and to plan and
15 design an apartment complex for the deaf and deaf-blind in
16 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county.

17 SECTION 8. PUBLIC EDUCATION DEPARTMENT PROJECTS--
18 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
19 of this act, upon certification by the public education
20 department that the need exists for the issuance of the bonds,
21 the following amounts are appropriated to the public education
22 department for the following purposes:

23 1. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
24 purchase and install art and drama equipment and information
25 technology, including related equipment, furniture and

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1 infrastructure, in La Academia de Esperanza charter school in
2 the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo county;

3 2. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to purchase
4 and install physical education equipment, including related
5 furniture, for all elementary schools in house district 25 in
6 the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo county;

7 3. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase and
8 install carpet for classrooms in the Montessori elementary
9 charter school in Bernalillo county;

10 4. eighty-six thousand dollars (\$86,000) to plan,
11 design and construct improvements to a city-owned facility,
12 including technological infrastructure, restrooms, a gymnasium,
13 a commons area and classrooms, for the Southwest Aeronautics,
14 Mathematics and Science Academy charter school in Bernalillo
15 county;

16 5. seventy-seven thousand dollars (\$77,000) to
17 plan, design, purchase and install a smart lab, including
18 related equipment, furniture and infrastructure, at the
19 Southwest Aeronautics, Mathematics and Science Academy charter
20 school in Bernalillo county;

21 6. thirty-seven thousand dollars (\$37,000) to
22 purchase and install information technology, communication
23 systems and telephone systems, including related equipment,
24 furniture and infrastructure, for all schools in house district
25 25 in the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo

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1 county;

2 7. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to plan,
3 design and construct a permanent facility for the Cien Aguas
4 international school in southeast Albuquerque in Bernalillo
5 county;

6 8. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) to purchase and
7 install a sound system in the main gymnasium at La Cueva high
8 school in the Albuquerque public school district in Albuquerque
9 in Bernalillo county;

10 9. one hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000)
11 to plan, design, purchase and install a smart lab, including
12 related equipment, furniture and infrastructure, at Southwest
13 intermediate learning center in Bernalillo county;

14 10. forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) to plan,
15 design, purchase and install a smart lab, including related
16 equipment, furniture and infrastructure, at the Southwest
17 primary learning center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

18 11. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
19 plan, design, purchase and install a smart lab, including
20 related equipment, furniture and infrastructure, at the
21 Southwest secondary learning center in Albuquerque in
22 Bernalillo county;

23 12. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
24 purchase and install information technology, including related
25 equipment, furniture and infrastructure, at Albuquerque high

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1 school in the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo
2 county;

3 13. fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) to
4 purchase and install information technology, communication
5 systems and telephone systems, including related equipment,
6 furniture and infrastructure, at the career enrichment center
7 in the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo county;

8 14. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for site
9 improvements, including landscaping, shade structures, drainage
10 and furniture, for the gardening project at Edward Gonzales
11 elementary school and West Mesa and Atrisco heritage academy
12 high schools in the Albuquerque public school district in
13 Bernalillo county;

14 15. three hundred seventy-seven thousand dollars
15 (\$377,000) to purchase and install information technology,
16 communication systems and telephone systems, including related
17 furniture, equipment and infrastructure, at Alvarado, Cochiti,
18 Edmund G. Ross, Griegos, Hodgin, La Luz, Los Ranchos, Douglas
19 MacArthur and Mission Avenue elementary schools, at Garfield
20 and Taft middle schools and at Valley high school in the
21 Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo county;

22 16. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase
23 and install communication and telephone systems and information
24 technology, including related equipment, furniture and
25 infrastructure, at Hayes, Van Buren and Wilson middle schools

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1 in the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo county;

2 17. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
3 purchase and install physical education equipment, including
4 related equipment and furniture, at Hawthorne, Tomasita and
5 McCollum elementary schools and at Kennedy and Grant middle
6 schools in the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo
7 county;

8 18. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
9 purchase and install physical education equipment, including
10 related equipment and furniture, at Alamosa, Carlos Rey, Edward
11 Gonzales, Helen Cordero and Mary Ann Binford elementary schools
12 in the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo county;

13 19. thirty-seven thousand dollars (\$37,000) to
14 purchase and install physical education equipment, including
15 related furniture, at Alamosa, Carlos Rey, Edward Gonzales and
16 Mary Ann Binford elementary schools and at Helen Cordero
17 primary school in the Albuquerque public school district in
18 Bernalillo county;

19 20. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
20 purchase and install physical education equipment and furniture
21 at Bandelier, Emerson, Kirtland, La Mesa, Mark Twain, Whittier
22 and Zia elementary schools in the Albuquerque public school
23 district in Bernalillo county;

24 21. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) to
25 purchase and install information technology, communication

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1 systems and telephone systems, including related equipment,
2 furniture and infrastructure, at Arroyo del Oso elementary
3 school in the Albuquerque public school district in Bernalillo
4 county;

5 22. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to purchase
6 and install physical education equipment, including related
7 equipment and furniture, at Arroyo del Oso elementary school in

4 PROJECT--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of
5 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the board of
6 regents of New Mexico institute of mining and technology that
7 the need exists for the issuance of the bonds, two hundred
8 thousand dollars (\$200,000) is appropriated to the board of
9 regents of New Mexico institute of mining and technology to
10 construct, equip and improve the Magdalena ridge observatory
11 and education and research unit for the New Mexico institute of
12 mining and technology in Socorro county.

13 SECTION 23. NEW MEXICO STATE UNIVERSITY PROJECTS--
14 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
15 of this act, upon certification by the board of regents of New
16 Mexico state university that the need exists for the issuance
17 of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the
18 board of regents of New Mexico state university for the
19 following purposes:

20 1. one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000) to
21 plan, design, construct, renovate, equip and furnish
22 improvements to athletic facilities, including demolition of
23 existing structures, at New Mexico state university in Las
24 Cruces in Dona Ana county;

25 2. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to plan,

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1 design, construct, renovate, equip and furnish nursing
2 facilities at New Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona
3 Ana county;

4 3. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to plan, design,
5 construct, renovate, equip and furnish rodeo facilities at New
6 Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county;

7 4. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to plan,
8 design, construct, renovate, equip and furnish a speech and
9 hearing clinic and to purchase and install information
10 technology at New Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona
11 Ana county;

12 5. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to plan,
13 design, renovate, equip, furnish and construct a winery
14 distillation science research laboratory at New Mexico state
15 university in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county;

16 6. five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to design,
17 conduct necessary demolition, renovate, construct, expand,
18 furnish and equip the Hershel Zohn theater and Branson library
19 at New Mexico state university in Las Cruces in Dona Ana
20 county;

21 7. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
22 purchase a trailer, a tractor, greenhouses and equipment for
23 the McKinley soil and water conservation district in McKinley
24 county; and

25 8. one hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$130,000)

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1 for a hydrogeologic study of the Sacramento mountains for the
2 Otero soil and water conservation district in Otero, Lincoln
3 and Chaves counties.

4 SECTION 24. NORTHERN NEW MEXICO STATE SCHOOL PROJECT--
5 SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
6 of this act, upon certification by the board of regents of
7 northern New Mexico state school that the need exists for the
8 issuance of the bonds, two hundred sixty-two thousand dollars
9 (\$262,000) is appropriated to the board of regents of northern
10 New Mexico state school to purchase and install equipment and
11 upgrades, including infrastructure, for the information
12 technology laboratories and system at northern New Mexico state
13 school in Espanola in Rio Arriba county.

14 SECTION 25. UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO PROJECTS--SEVERANCE
15 TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this
16 act, upon certification by the board of regents of the
17 university of New Mexico that the need exists for the issuance
18 of the bonds, the following amounts are appropriated to the
19 board of regents of the university of New Mexico for the
20 following purposes:

21 1. one million three hundred seventy-nine thousand
22 dollars (\$1,379,000) to plan, design and construct improvements
23 to the athletic fields at the university of New Mexico in
24 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county, contingent upon a joint
25 powers agreement between the university, the Albuquerque public

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1 school district and the New Mexico activities association for
2 shared use of the fields;

3 2. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
4 design, purchase, equip and install campus safety lighting at
5 the university of New Mexico in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
6 county;

7 3. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) to
8 purchase and install equipment for the burn care center at
9 university of New Mexico hospital in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
10 county;

11 4. four hundred seventy-seven thousand dollars
12 (\$477,000) to purchase and install medical equipment and
13 related technology, including ultrasound equipment, at the
14 university of New Mexico hospital in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
15 county; and

16 5. one million one hundred ninety-seven thousand
17 dollars (\$1,197,000) to improve and replace roofs at the
18 university of New Mexico in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county.

19 **SECTION 26. WESTERN NEW MEXICO UNIVERSITY PROJECT--**
20 **SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--**Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1
21 of this act, upon certification by the board of regents of
22 western New Mexico university that the need exists for the
23 issuance of the bonds, four hundred ninety thousand dollars
24 (\$490,000) is appropriated to the board of regents of western
25 New Mexico university to purchase and install information

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1 technology, including related equipment, furniture,
2 infrastructure and storage technology, at western New Mexico
3 university in Silver City in Grant county.

4 SECTION 27. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION DISTRICT
5 PRIORITY PROJECTS--APPROPRIATION INTO AND FROM THE STATE ROAD
6 FUND--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--Pursuant to the provisions of
7 Section 1 of this act, upon certification by the department of
8 transportation that the need exists for the issuance of the
9 bonds, twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000) is appropriated to
10 the state road fund for equal distribution to each of the
11 department's six highway construction districts for district
12 priority projects, including pavement preservation and other
13 projects that preserve the department's investment in highway
14 facilities.

15 SECTION 28. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PASEO DEL NORTE
16 PROJECT--APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE ROAD FUND--SEVERANCE TAX
17 BONDS.--

18 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this
19 act, the state board of finance may issue and sell severance
20 tax bonds in fiscal years 2013 and 2014, in compliance with the
21 Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding a total of
22 thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000) when the department of
23 transportation certifies the need for the issuance of the
24 bonds; provided that:

25 (a) in fiscal year 2013, no more than fifteen

1 million dollars (\$15,000,000) in bonds shall be issued; and

2 (b) in fiscal year 2014, no more than fifteen
3 million dollars (\$15,000,000) in bonds shall be issued.

4 2. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
5 appropriated to the state road fund for the department of
6 transportation to use for a design and build delivery system
7 for the planning, environmental clearance, design, acquisition
8 of rights of way, new construction and reconstruction of the
9 interchange at the intersection of Paseo del Norte boulevard
10 and interstate 25 in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county,
11 notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection A of Section
12 13-1-119.1 NMSA 1978 and contingent on an equal or greater
13 match from sources other than the state.

14 **SECTION 29. COMPLETION OF PROJECTS IMPACTING HEALTH AND**
15 **SAFETY AT LOCAL GOVERNMENT LEVEL STATEWIDE--SEVERANCE TAX**
16 **BONDS.--**Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this act,
17 upon certification by the following agencies that the need
18 exists for the issuance of the bonds, the following amounts are
19 appropriated to the following agencies for completion of
20 incomplete projects for the following purposes:

21 1. to the department of environment:

22 (a) eight hundred eighteen thousand dollars
23 (\$818,000) to construct the potable wastewater reuse project
24 and facility in Cloudcroft in Otero county; and

25 (b) one hundred fifty thousand dollars

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1 (\$150,000) to plan, design, construct and equip water system
2 improvements, including a well and arsenic treatment unit, for
3 the San Antonio mutual domestic water consumers association in
4 Socorro county;

5 2. to the Indian affairs department:

6 (a) one hundred fifty thousand dollars
7 (\$150,000) to plan, design, construct, purchase, install, equip
8 and furnish a head start facility for the Little Water chapter
9 of the Navajo Nation in San Juan county; and

10 (b) four hundred sixty-six thousand dollars
11 (\$466,000) to plan, design, construct and equip a language,
12 cultural and education center in the Pueblo of Cochiti in Santa
13 Fe county; and

14 3. to the local government division:

15 (a) four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000)
16 to plan, design, construct, equip and furnish emergency
17 management facilities at the county fairgrounds in Catron
18 county;

19 (b) four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000)
20 to plan, design, construct, equip and furnish the county health
21 clinic in Reserve in Catron county;

22 (c) four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to plan,
23 design, construct and furnish the county complex in Mora in
24 Mora county;

25 (d) forty-two thousand four hundred dollars

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1 (\$42,400) to construct and furnish the Watrous community center
2 in Mora county;

3 (e) one million eight hundred fifty thousand
4 dollars (\$1,850,000) to plan, design and construct a visitors'
5 center at Casa San Ysidro in Corrales in Sandoval county;

6 (f) five hundred eleven thousand four hundred
7 dollars (\$511,400) to plan, design, construct and equip
8 improvements, including seating and electrical and
9 accessibility improvements, to the Oscar Huber memorial
10 ballpark and grandstands in Madrid in Santa Fe county; and

11 (g) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)

14 **SECTION 30. DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**

15 PROJECT--APPROPRIATION FROM THE EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT REVOLVING
16 FUNDS.--One million dollars (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from
17 the equipment replacement revolving funds to the department of
18 information technology for expenditure in fiscal years 2012
19 through 2016, unless otherwise provided for in Section 2 of
20 this act, for two-way radios and antenna systems and upgrades
21 to support public safety communications statewide.

22 **SECTION 31. DEPARTMENT OF GAME AND FISH PROJECT--**

23 APPROPRIATION FROM THE GAME AND FISH BOND RETIREMENT FUND.--One
24 hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the
25 game and fish bond retirement fund to the department of game

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1 and fish for expenditure in fiscal years 2012 through 2016,
2 unless otherwise provided for in Section 2 of this act, for
3 improvements to facilities statewide, including warehouses,
4 laboratories, the Raton area office, the Bear Canyon dam
5 spillway, the Gordon railroad crossing, alternative energy
6 assessments and the Bernardo house demolition and replacement
7 project.

8 **SECTION 32. DEPARTMENT OF GAME AND FISH PROJECT--**
9 **APPROPRIATION FROM THE GAME PROTECTION FUND.--**Five hundred
10 forty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$547,500) is
11 appropriated from the game protection fund to the department of
12 game and fish for expenditure in fiscal years 2012 through
13 2016, unless otherwise provided for in Section 2 of this act,
14 for improvements to facilities statewide, including warehouses,
15 laboratories, the Raton area office, the Bear Canyon dam
16 spillway, the Gordon railroad crossing, alternative energy
17 assessments and the Bernardo house demolition and replacement
18 project.

19 **SECTION 33. MINERS' COLFAX MEDICAL CENTER PROJECT--**
20 **APPROPRIATION FROM THE MINERS' TRUST FUND.--**One million dollars
21 (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from the miners' trust fund to the
22 miners' Colfax medical center for expenditure in fiscal years
23 2012 through 2016, unless otherwise provided for in Section 2
24 of this act, for the stucco project and for paving, drainage,
25 lighting and security improvements at miners' Colfax medical

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1 center in Raton in Colfax county.

2 **SECTION 34. WASTEWATER FACILITY CONSTRUCTION LOAN FUND--**
3 APPROPRIATION FROM THE PUBLIC PROJECT REVOLVING FUND.--One
4 million four hundred thousand dollars (\$1,400,000) is
5 appropriated from the public project revolving fund to the
6 wastewater facility construction loan fund for expenditure in
7 fiscal year 2012 and subsequent fiscal years to implement the
8 provisions of the Wastewater Facility Construction Loan Act or
9 to provide state matching funds required by the terms of any
10 federal grant under the Clean Water Act.

11 **SECTION 35. PUBLIC EDUCATION DEPARTMENT PROJECT--**
12 APPROPRIATION FROM THE PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL OUTLAY FUND.--Two
13 million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) is
14 appropriated from the public school capital outlay fund to the
15 public school capital outlay council, contingent upon approval
16 of the public school capital outlay council, for expenditure in
17 fiscal year 2012 and subsequent fiscal years to renovate and
18 construct public school pre-kindergarten classrooms statewide.

19 **SECTION 36. DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION PROJECT--**
20 APPROPRIATION FROM THE STATE ROAD FUND.--Three hundred fifty
21 thousand dollars (\$350,000) is appropriated from the state road
22 fund to the department of transportation for expenditure in
23 fiscal years 2012 through 2016, unless otherwise provided for
24 in Section 2 of this act, for purchase, installation and
25 construction of salt storage facilities statewide.

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1 **SECTION 37. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMPLEX--CHANGE TO**
2 **MANUEL LUJAN BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--**The
3 unexpended balance of the appropriation to the capital program
4 fund in Subsection 15 of Section 7 of Chapter 125 of Laws 2009
5 for the health and human services complex in Santa Fe in Santa
6 Fe county shall not be expended for the original purpose but is
7 changed for infrastructure improvements, renovations,
8 furnishing and equipping the Manuel Lujan building in Santa Fe
9 in Santa Fe county.

10 **SECTION 38. HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT INFORMATION**
11 **TECHNOLOGY--CHANGE TO SCHOOL BUS PURCHASE STATEWIDE--CHANGE**
12 **AGENCY--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--**Two million five hundred thousand
13 dollars (\$2,500,000) of the unexpended balance of the
14 appropriation to the human services department in Laws 2011
15 (S.S.), Chapter 5, Section 11 for information technology shall
16 not be expended for the original purpose but is appropriated to
17 the public education department to purchase school buses
18 statewide.

19 **SECTION 39. HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT INFORMATION**
20 **TECHNOLOGY--CHANGE TO PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS STATEWIDE--**
21 **CHANGE AGENCY--SEVERANCE TAX BONDS.--**Three million dollars
22 (\$3,000,000) of the unexpended balance of the appropriation to
23 the human services department in Laws 2011 (S.S.), Chapter 5,
24 Section 11 for information technology shall not be expended for
25 the original purpose but is appropriated to the department of

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1 information technology for two-way radios and antenna systems
2 and upgrades to support public safety communications statewide.

3 SECTION 40. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES.--If an
4 appropriation for a project authorized in this act is not
5 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the
6 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes
7 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be made
8 for purposes other than those specified in the appropriation.

9 SECTION 41. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section
10 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations
11 authorized in this act include one percent for the art in
12 public places fund.

13 SECTION 42. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
14 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
