19	SECTION 1. Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996,
20	Chapter 71, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
21	"21-1-4.3. LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY SCHOLARSHIPS
22	AUTHORIZEDCERTAIN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS
23	A. To the extent that funds are made available by
24	the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the boards of
25	regents of New Mexico state university, New Mexico institute of
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mining and technology, eastern New Mexico university, western New Mexico university, the university of New Mexico, New Mexico highlands university and northern New Mexico college shall award legislative lottery scholarships for tuition for qualified resident students attending their respective institutions and branches of those institutions.

Β. Except as otherwise authorized in this section, the legislative lottery scholarships authorized in this section shall apply only to full-time resident students who, [immediately upon] within two years of completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, are accepted for entrance to and attend one of the state educational institutions set forth in this section or one of the branches of those institutions. Each legislative lottery scholarship shall be awarded for up to four consecutive years beginning the second semester of the recipient's first year of enrollment if the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during the first semester of full-time enrollment.

The legislative lottery scholarships authorized C. in this section shall also apply to full-time resident students who, immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, attend a two-year .190362.1

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1 public post-secondary educational institution in New Mexico and 2 who, upon the completion of that curriculum or at the end of two years, whichever is sooner, transfer to one of the post-3 secondary state educational institutions set forth in this 4 5 Those students shall be eligible for a legislative section. lottery scholarship for two consecutive years if they maintain 6 7 residency in New Mexico, maintain a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale and attend the institution full time 8 9 during the regular academic year.

D. The legislative lottery scholarships authorized in this section shall also apply to full-time resident students who:

(1) within [one hundred twenty days] two years
of completion of a high school curriculum at a public or
accredited private New Mexico high school, or of receiving a
graduate equivalent diploma, begin service in the United States
armed forces; and

(2) within [one year] two years of completion of honorable service or medical discharge from the service, attend one of the state educational institutions set forth in this section.

E. The higher education department shall prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the legislative lottery scholarship program. Guidelines shall be .190362.1

For purposes of the legislative lottery 4 F. 5 scholarship program as it applies to students with disabilities who may require special accommodations, the 6 7 higher education department, in consultation with the student and the office at the institution that serves students with 8 9 disabilities, shall review both the definition of "full time" and the maximum number of consecutive semesters of 10 eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed reasonable 11 12 and appropriate, based on the student's disability needs. In no case, however, shall "full time" mean fewer than six 13 credit hours per semester, and in no case shall eligibility 14 extend beyond fourteen consecutive semesters." 15

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
