16	SECTION 1. Section 18-12-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
17	Chapter 42, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:

20	A. The "board of directors of the national Hispanic
21	cultural center" is created. The board shall consist of
22	fifteen residents of New Mexico appointed by the governor with
23	the advice and consent of the senate. Two of the appointees
24	shall be employees of state institutions of higher education or
25	appropriate state agencies. <u>If the board has an operating</u>
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		agreement with a nonprofit organization that complies with
	2	Section 6-5A-1 NMSA 1978, the nonprofit organization with which
	3	the operating agreement is made may nominate two of its board
	4	members to the governor for appointment to one-year terms. If
	5	a vacancy occurs in either of these two positions, the
	6	nonprofit organization's governing board may nominate a
	7	<u>replacement.</u>
	8	<u>B.</u> In making the appointments, the governor shall
	9	give due consideration to:

If a vacancy occurs on the board, the governor 8 9 shall appoint another member to complete the unexpired term. $[E_{\cdot}]$ F. 2	with private or public organizations, agencies or individuals

5	$[E_{\bullet}]$ (5) authorize the director to solicit and
6	receive funds or property of any nature for the development of
7	the center, its collections and its programs;
8	$[F_{\bullet}]$ (6) adopt such rules as may be necessary
9	to carry out the provisions of the National Hispanic Cultural
10	Center Act; and
11	$[G_{\cdot}]$ (7) establish policy, determine the
12	mission and direct the development of the center.
13	B. The board may, beginning July 1, 2013, enter
14	into or remain a party to an operating agreement with a
15	nonprofit organization only if the operating agreement allows
16	the board to appoint, at its sole discretion, two of the
17	board's voting members to the governing board of the nonprofit
18	organization, and only if the governing board of the nonprofit
19	organization has at least five members.
20	C. If a person is concurrently a member of the
21	board and a member of a governing board of a nonprofit
22	organization that has an operating agreement with the board
23	that complies with Section 6-5A-1 NMSA 1978, the person shall
24	not vote on matters relating to the operating agreement."
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
