RECOGNIZING MARCH 8, 2013 AS "ESPANOLA VALLEY DAY" AT THE NEW MEXICO SENATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that March 8, 2013 be recognized as "Espanola Valley Day" at the New Mexico senate, honoring the entire Espanola valley for its diversity of culture and long-standing Hispanic traditions; and
