#### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 52 would require first-time DWI offenders to attend a DWI follow-up program 3-5 months after the offender completes DWI school.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

In order to provide a follow-up program statewide, NMDOT will need to develop a standardized curriculum and disseminate the approved materials and curriculum, or identify a contractor that can provide the services. The estimated cost for development and dissemination of the statewide follow-up curriculum is between \$50 thousand - \$100 thousand per year. The NMDOT's cost estimate is based on current expenditures for its DWI school.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The legislation does not define "DWI follow-up program" leaving it unclear what kind of program would qualify, though it does indicate that such a program would have to be approved by the Traffic Safety Bureau. Without knowing the content, duration, or focus of such a "follow-up program" it is difficult to evaluate the possible fiscal implications.

It is unknown what fee, if any, would be charged to the offender for the follow-up program.

# ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The proposed follow-up course would require additional monitoring by NMDOT to ensure compliance with regulations that would be adopted.

## **ALTERNATIVES**

A fee could be charged for holding the follow- up program to offset the cost.
