SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 339 (SB 339) revises statutory references to the Property Control Division (PCD) and the Building Services Division (BSD) to combine them into a new Facilities Management Division (FMD) within the GSD. The bill also makes minor semantic changes to correct terms.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill makes no changes to available funding sources for the department.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The PCD is responsible for state agency space requirements and oversees 750 state-owned buildings and 400 leased properties. The BSD is responsible for maintenance of state-owned buildings in the Santa Fe area. The GSD believes the new name is more reflective of what the organization does: provide facilities management under the control of a single organization.

All State buildings and land are under the control of the PCD with the exception of:

- State Armory Board
- Office of Cultural Affairs
- State Fair Commission
- Department of Game and Fish
- State Highway and Transportation Department
- Commissioner of Public Lands
- State Parks Division of the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department
- State Institutions of Higher Learning
- The New Mexico School for the Deaf
- The New Mexico School for the Visually Handicapped
- The Judicial Branch
- The Legislative Branch

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

The bill does not alter the scope of the power or authority of the newly named FMD.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

The bill is not needed to combine the two divisions. Section 9-17-3 (A) names the 6 divisions within the General Services Department and paragraphs (B) and (C) empowers the GSD secretary and/or the governor to merge those divisions in the interest of efficiency or economy.
