SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 494 (SB494) amends Section 72-2-9.1 by substituting language in one subsection, and adding language in another subsection, clarifying that priority administration rules adopted by the State Engineer shall be enforced and be consistent with Article 16 of the New Mexico constitution and the doctrine of prior appropriation.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No Fiscal Impact.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to the OSE, SB 494 merely sets out the existing state of the law, that all rules adopted by the State Engineer must be consistent with the constitution and statutes. However, it requires the OSE to enforce prior appropriation which is not being done for all water resources.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

The OSE notes, there is no administrative implications, since the legislation does not appear to affect the State Engineer's regulatory authority.
