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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLESections 1
18	through 5 of this act may be cited as the "Legislative Lottery
19	Scholarship Act".
20	SECTION 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DEFINITIONSAs used in the
21	Legislative Lottery Scholarship Act:
22	A. "community college" means a branch community
23	college of a state educational institution or a community
24	college or technical and vocational institute established
25	pursuant to Chapter 21, Article 13 or 16 NMSA 1978,
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B. "comprehensive institution" means eastern New
Mexico university, western New Mexico university, New Mexico
highlands university or northern New Mexico college;

5 C. "department" means the higher education6 department;

D. "fund" means the lottery tuition fund;

E. "legislative lottery scholarship" means a scholarship that provides financial assistance only for tuition costs incurred by a qualified student attending any public post-secondary educational institution in a uniform amount determined annually by the department;

F. "public post-secondary educational institution" means a community college, comprehensive institution, research institution or state educational institution;

G. "qualified student" means a student who meets eligibility requirements pursuant to the Legislative Lottery Scholarship Act and department rules; who graduated with a diploma from a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or received a high school equivalency credential in New Mexico; and who either:

(1) immediately upon graduation or receipt of
 a high school equivalency credential was accepted for entrance
 to and attended a public post-secondary educational
 institution; or

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 completion of a high school curriculum or receipt of a high
 school equivalency credential began service in the United
 States armed forces and within one year of completion of
 honorable service or medical discharge from the service
 attended a public post-secondary educational institution;

H. "research institution" means the university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university or New Mexico institute of mining and technology; and

I. "state educational institution" means an institution of higher education enumerated in Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico.

SECTION 3. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DISTRIBUTIONS FROM THE FUND FOR LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY SCHOLARSHIPS--RULES.--

A. By May 1, 2014 and May 1 of each subsequent year, the department shall determine the total amount of money available for distribution from the fund to public postsecondary educational institutions for the upcoming academic year based on appropriations from the legislature, solvency maintenance and criteria established by the department in rule.

B. By August 1, 2014, in collaboration with the council of university presidents, the New Mexico association of community colleges and the New Mexico independent community colleges, the department shall establish criteria in rule for the equitable distribution of money from the fund to each

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public post-secondary educational institution based on enrollment data, tuition costs and other considerations agreed upon in the collaboration.

C. By August 15, 2014 and August 15 of each subsequent year, the department shall distribute to each public post-secondary educational institution an amount of money from the fund in accordance with criteria established pursuant to Subsection B of this section.

9 SECTION 4. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY
 10 SCHOLARSHIPS--AUTHORIZED--QUALIFIED STUDENTS.--

A. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the fund, a board of regents or governing body of a public post-secondary educational institution shall determine the quantity of legislative lottery scholarships to award and the amounts of the awards for some or all qualified students who meet eligibility requirements according to institutional needs, missions and goals.

B. A qualified student who is otherwise eligible for a legislative lottery scholarship must maintain residency in the state.

C. Based on the needs of a student with disabilities who requires and requests an accommodation, the office at a state educational institution that serves students with disabilities shall review the minimum credit hours and the maximum number of consecutive semesters required for

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eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed reasonable and
 appropriate.

SECTION 5. Section 6-24-23 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1995, Chapter 155, Section 23, as amended) is recompiled in the Legislative Lottery Scholarship Act and is amended to read: "LOTTERY TUITION FUND CREATED--PURPOSE.--

A. The "lottery tuition fund" is created in the state treasury. The fund shall be administered by the [commission on higher education] department. Earnings from investment of the fund shall accrue to the credit of the fund. Any balance in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall remain in the fund for appropriation by the legislature as provided in this section.

B. Money in the [lottery tuition] fund [is] shall <u>be</u> appropriated <u>by the legislature</u> to the [commission on higher <u>education</u>] <u>department</u> for distribution to New Mexico's [public <u>post-secondary</u>] <u>state</u> educational institutions to provide tuition assistance for [New Mexico resident undergraduates as <u>provided by law</u>] <u>qualified students as provided in the</u> <u>Legislative Lottery Scholarship Act</u>."

SECTION 6. Section 21-13-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 17, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read: "21-13-10. BOARD DUTIES.--

A. It is the duty of the community college board to determine financial and educational policies of the community .195967.2

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college. The community college board shall provide for the management of the community college and execution of these policies by selecting a competent president for the community college, and, upon the president's recommendation, the board shall employ other administrative personnel, instructional staff or other personnel as may be needed for the operation, maintenance and administration of the community college.

B. The community college board shall have the power to fix tuition and fee rates for resident and nonresident students of the community college district, to accept gifts, to accept federal aid, to purchase, hold, sell and rent property and equipment and to promote the general welfare of the institution for the best interest of educational service to the people of the community college district.

[C. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the community college board shall award legislative lottery scholarships for qualified resident students attending their respective institutions.

D. The legislative lottery scholarships authorized in this section shall apply only to full-time resident students who, immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, are accepted for entrance to and attend a community college. Each legislative .195967.2

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lottery scholarship shall be awarded for up to two consecutive years beginning the second semester of the recipient's first year of enrollment, provided that the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during the first semester of fulltime enrollment.

E. The higher education department shall prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing 8 eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the legislative lottery scholarship program. Guidelines shall be 10 distributed to community college boards to enable a uniform 12 availability of the resident student lottery tuition scholarships. 13

F. For purposes of the legislative lottery scholarship program as it applies to students with disabilities who may require special accommodations, the higher education department, in consultation with the student and the office at the community college that serves students with disabilities, shall review both the definition of "full time" and the maximum number of consecutive semesters of eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed reasonable and appropriate, based on the student's disability needs. In no case, however, shall "full time" mean fewer than six credit hours per semester, and in no case shall eligibility extend beyond fourteen consecutive semesters.]"
