WHEREAS, thirteen years ago, many of these voices joined together to form a nationwide grassroots movement called the American cancer society cancer action network, an organization united and relentless in pursuit of its mission

WHEREAS, people without access to quality, affordable health care are significantly more likely to be diagnosed with advanced-stage cancer, resulting in significantly worse health outcomes for low-income and uninsured cancer patients; and

WHEREAS, the five-year survival rate for cancer is sixty-eight percent, up from forty-nine percent nearly forty years ago, thanks to cancer research as well as lifesaving cancer prevention, screening, early detection and treatment programs; and

WHEREAS, it is essential to preserve the quality of life and dignity of all people who have struggled with cancer and who often feel isolated, stigmatized and misunderstood; and

WHEREAS, volunteers and members of the American cancer society cancer action network work diligently every day to advocate on behalf of cancer patients, survivors and caregivers so that one day cancer will be eliminated as a major public health issue;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that it honor cancer patients and survivors and their families and other caregivers, remember those people who have been lost to cancer and declare Monday, February 10, 2014, as "Create Hope for a Cancer-Free World Day in the Senate"; and
