SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 255 appropriates \$200 thousand from the General Fund to the State Equalization Guarantee distribution of the Public School Fund to fund an early childhood literacy program.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill's appropriation of \$200 thousand is a recurring expense to the General Fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY15 shall revert.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

In FY14, the SEG included \$4 million for early reading intervention. The LFC recommendation for FY15 includes \$5 million for the same purpose. Additionally, the FY14 budget included \$11.5 million for the governor's early reading initiative and LFC recommended \$13.5 million for FY15. PED states that with approximately 106,000 students in grades K-3 and 4,230 children in PED PreK programs, the \$200 thousand appropriation in SB 255 will provide minimal impact.
