## Bill Summary:

SB 223 amends the School Personnel Act to phase-in, over a period of five years, increases in the statutory minimum salaries of teachers and principals as follows:

- For Level 1 teachers, from $\$ 30,000$ for a standard nine and one-half month contract:
$>$ to $\$ 32,000$ for school year 2015-2016;
$>$ to $\$ 34,000$ for school year 2016-2017;
$>$ to \$36,000 for school year 2017-2018;
$>$ to $\$ 38,000$ for school year 2018-2019; and
$>$ to $\$ 40,000$ for school year 2019-2020.
- For Level 2 teachers, from $\$ 40,000$ for a standard nine and one-half month contract:
$>$ to \$42,000 for school year 2015-2016;
$>$ to $\$ 44,000$ for school year 2016-2017;
> to \$46,000 for school year 2017-2018;
$>$ to $\$ 48,000$ for school year 2018-2019; and
$>$ to \$50,000 for school year 2019-2020.
- For Level 3-A teachers, from $\$ 50,000$ for a standard nine and one-half month contract:
$>$ to \$52,000 for school year 2015-2016;
$>$ to \$54,000 for school year 2016-2017;
$>$ to \$56,000 for school year 2017-2018;
$>$ to $\$ 58,000$ for school year 2018-2019; and
$>$ to \$60,000 for school year 2019-2020.
For school principals, administrators, and assistant school principals ${ }^{1}$ on a standard one-year contract, SB 223 requires the same minimum salary provided for Level 3-A teachers beginning with school year 2015-2016, multiplied, as current law provides, by the applicable responsibility factor. If enacted, the provisions of SB 223 become effective July 1, 2015.

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## Fiscal Impact:

\$11,328,173 is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Equalization Guarantee (SEG) for the first-year phase-in of the teacher and principal salary increase for FY 16. Unexpended or unencumbered balances remaining at the end of FY 15 revert to the General Fund.

For FY 15 minimum salary increases, the cost is estimated to be $\$ 11,328,173$, as shown in the table below.

This cost estimate assumes:

- school year 2014-2015 staffing levels;
- comparable need to fill vacant positions each year of the phase in;
- no additional benefit costs after school year 2014-2015; and
- no other salary increases during the timeframe.

As shown in the table below, the total five year cost is estimated to be $\$ 122,411,166$.

These cost estimates should be viewed as conservative estimates for costs as they do not consider the following factors:

- salaries partially paid with federal funds;
- any additional salary increases that would occur in the normal course of a teacher's career (i.e. those related to length of service or performance); or
- any future salary increases that may appropriated by the Legislature.


## Substantive Issues:

The Attachment, Chart 22, Teachers' Salaries: Average Salaries (Budgeted) By Level and District, School Year 2014-2015, from the 2015 LESC Public School Data reference Guide, outlines average budgeted salaries by teacher licensure level, districts, and charter schools, for school year 2014-2015. The statewide average salaries, by teacher licensure level, are summarized on page 6 , line 150 , as:

- $\$ 31,856.13$ for internship teachers;
- \$32,907.45 for Level 1 teachers;
- $\$ 44,988.87$ for Level 2 teachers; and
- $\$ 53,337.78$ for Level 3 teachers.


## Background:

## Legislative Education Study Committee 2014 Interim Discussion

The topic of the state's regional competitiveness for educator salaries continues to be discussed during the Legislative Education Study Committee (LESC) interim meetings. During the September 2014 interim meeting, committee members heard testimony that informed the committee on the support the energy industry provides for New Mexico education. Part of the testimony included discussion that the state's regional energy employment plans should include more education funding to pay teacher salaries, including those that are competitive with Texas, which can be $\$ 10,000$ or higher than what New Mexico offers. Further discussion indicated that housing and other factors compound educator salary issues.

## Teacher Minimum Salaries

In 2003, LESC-endorsed public school reform legislation was enacted to create a three-tiered teacher licensure, evaluation, and salary system.

This three-tiered system had been recommended by the Education Initiatives and Accountability Task Force and the LESC Ad Hoc Subcommittee for Education Reform. The law describes this licensure framework as "a progressive career system in which licensees are required to demonstrate increased competencies and undertake increased duties as they progress through the licensure levels."

The minimum salaries for each of the prescribed levels were also established in law: \$30,000 for Level 1; \$40,000 for Level 2; and \$50,000 for Level 3-A. The complete five-year phase-in period is as follows:

- Level 1, Provisional Teacher: $\$ 30,000$ in school year 2003-2004;
- Level 2, Professional Teacher: \$35,000 in school year 2004-2005 and \$40,000 in school year 2005-2006; and
- Level 3-A, Master Teacher: \$45,000 in school year 2006-2007 and \$50,000 in school year 2007-2008.


## Administrator Minimum Salaries

In 2007 LESC-endorsed legislation was enacted to establish, beginning in FY 08, the minimum salary of school principals and assistant principals at $\$ 50,000$ multiplied by an applicable responsibility factor. The definitions of the School Personnel Act provide for the separate responsibility factors as follows:

- 1.20 for an elementary school principal;
- 1.40 for a middle school or junior high school principal;
- 1.60 for a high school principal;
- 1.10 for an assistant elementary school principal; and
- 1.25 for an assistant high school principal.
