shall not be adjusted upward by more than four percent in any one year as a result of an increase in the cost of living.

[B.] <u>C.</u> An employer furnishing food, utilities, supplies or housing to an employee who is engaged in agriculture may deduct the reasonable value of such furnished items from any wages due to the employee.

7 [C. An employee who customarily and regularly receives more than thirty dollars (\$30.00) a month in tips 8 9 shall be paid a minimum hourly wage of two dollars thirteen cents (\$2.13). The employer may consider tips as part of 10 wages, but the tips combined with the employer's cash wage 11 12 shall not equal less than the minimum wage rate as provided in Subsection A of this section. All tips received by such 13 14 employees shall be retained by the employee, except that nothing in this section shall prohibit the pooling of tips 15 among employees.] 16

D. An employee shall not be required to work more than forty hours in any week of seven days, unless the employee is paid one and one-half times the employee's regular hourly rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours. For an employee who is paid a fixed salary for fluctuating hours and who is employed by an employer a majority of whose business in New Mexico consists of providing investigative services to the federal government, the hourly rate may be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the federal Fair Labor
