- A school district shall bear any administrative costs associated with the establishment and implementation of a community school within the school district.
- Subject to the availability of funding, grants for community schools initiatives are available to a school district, a group of public schools or a public school that has demonstrated partnerships with any lead agency and local, private and public agencies for the purpose of establishing, operating and sustaining community schools and that meets department eligibility requirements.
- C. Applications for grants for community schools initiatives shall be in the form prescribed by the department and shall include the following information:
- a statement of need, including demographic and socioeconomic information about the area to be served by the community schools initiative;
- goals and expected outcomes of the initiative;
- (3) services and activities to be provided by the initiative;
- (4) written agreements for the provision of services by public and private agencies, community groups and .200285.1
