Unless a law enforcement officer reasonably determines that the circumstances of a request for emergency 21 response require immediate action, in order to determine 22 whether the request for emergency response is pretextual, the 23 officer or other delegated agent within the law enforcement 24 agency shall check relevant databases before or concurrently 25 .199622.2

A law enforcement agency shall not request

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with initiating the request for telecommunications device call 1 location information from a wireless telecommunications 2 provider. This action may include: 3 checking the federal bureau of 4 (1) 5 investigation's national crime information center to identify if the person making the call for emergency services or 6 7 initiating the request for emergency response has a history of 8 domestic violence or other criminal history suggesting that the 9 request may be pretextual; and checking with the secretary of state's 10 (2) office to identify if the user for whom the call location 11 12 information is being requested is participating in the address confidentiality program pursuant to Section 40-13-11 NMSA 1978. 13 14 Ε. A wireless telecommunications provider may establish protocols by which the provider voluntarily discloses 15 telecommunications device call location information to a law 16 enforcement agency for the purposes outlined in Subsection A of 17 18 this section.

F. No cause of action shall be brought in any court against any wireless telecommunications provider, its officers, employees, agents or other specified persons for providing telecommunications device call location information when acting in good faith and in accordance with the provisions of this section.

G. All wireless telecommunications providers .199622.2

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registered to do business in this state, and all resellers of wireless telecommunications services, shall submit emergency contact information to the department of public safety in order to facilitate requests from a law enforcement agency for call location information in accordance with this section, which information shall be updated within forty-eight hours whenever there is a change.

H. The department of public safety shall maintain a database containing emergency contact information for all wireless telecommunications providers registered to do business in this state and shall make that information immediately available upon request to facilitate a response to a request from a law enforcement agency for telecommunications device call location information pursuant to this section.

I. This section does not prohibit a wireless telecommunications provider from establishing protocols by which the provider voluntarily discloses telecommunications device location information to a law enforcement agency.

J. The department of public safety may promulgate by rule criteria for fulfilling the requirements of this section.

K. For the purposes of this section:

(1) "law enforcement agency" means a certified local or state law enforcement agency, including a local police or sheriff's department, the New Mexico state police and the .199622.2

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motor transportation division of the department of public safety;

3 (2) "law enforcement officer" means a state or
4 municipal police officer, county sheriff, deputy sheriff,
5 conservation officer, motor transportation enforcement officer
6 or other state employee authorized by state law to enforce
7 criminal statutes;

8 (3) "telecommunications device" means a
9 telephone or other electronic device enabling communication
10 utilizing radio waves, light waves or other electromagnetic
11 means;

(4) "telecommunications device location information" means information indicating the physical geographical location of a telecommunications device;

(5) "wireless telecommunications provider"
means a telephone company, transmission company,
telecommunications common carrier, telecommunications company,
cellular or other wireless telecommunications service company
registered to do business in this state; and

(6) "wireless telecommunications service" means the transmission of signs, signals, writings, images, sounds, messages, data or other information of any nature by radio, lightwaves or other electromagnetic means.

SECTION 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately. .199622.2

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
