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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 1-4-18.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2013,
17	Chapter 91, Section 1) is amended to read:
18	"1-4-18.1. ONLINE VOTER REGISTRATION [UPDATES]
19	[A. In addition to updating a certificate of
20	registration in person or by mail, a voter may in accordance
21	with the provisions of Sections 1-4-15 through 1-4-18 NMSA 1978
22	update an existing certificate of registration electronically
23	by completing a certificate of registration form on the
24	secretary of state's web site. Upon receipt of an updated
25	certificate of registration, the secretary of state shall
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transmit the certificate to the county clerk of the county in which the registrant resides, and the county clerk shall print the updated certificate, file it in the county's register of voters and enter it into the statewide voter file.

5 B. A certificate of registration updated 6 electronically shall be electronically authenticated by the 7 registrant using an electronic signature in conformance with 8 the Electronic Authentication of Documents Act and the Uniform 9 Electronic Transactions Act. A certificate of registration that is electronically authenticated in accordance with the 10 provisions of this subsection shall be deemed to have been 11 12 subscribed and sworn to by the registrant.

C. The secretary of state shall ensure that the web site used for electronic registration is secure and that the confidentiality of all users and integrity of data submitted are preserved. The secretary of state shall implement the provisions of this section no later than June 30, 2015.]

A. A person may complete a certificate of registration in person or by mail. In addition, the secretary of state shall, not later than January 1, 2016, allow a voter to submit an update to an existing certificate of registration and, not later than July 1, 2017, allow a qualified elector to submit a new certificate of registration form electronically through a web site authorized by the secretary of state or through any computer system maintained by a state agency for

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1 electronic voter registration that is approved by the secretary 2 of state; provided that the person is qualified to register to 3 vote and has a current or expired New Mexico driver's license 4 or state identification card issued by the motor vehicle 5 division of the taxation and revenue department. B. An online certificate of registration form shall 6 7 contain all of the information that is required for a paper form. The person shall also be required to provide the 8 9 person's full New Mexico driver's license number or state identification card number. 10 C. When a person submits a new certificate of 11 12 registration or an update to an existing certificate of registration, the person shall mark the box associated with the 13 following statement included as part of the electronic 14 certificate of registration form: 15 "By clicking the boxes below, I swear or affirm all of the 16 following: 17 □ I am the person whose name and identifying 18 information is provided on this form, and I desire to register 19 to vote in the state of New Mexico; and 20 \Box all of the information that I have provided on 21 this form is true and correct as of the date I am submitting 22 this form.". 23 D. 8	E. Prior to January 1, 2017, the secretary of
9	state, in conjunction with the county clerks of the state,
10	shall adopt rules establishing a uniform and nondiscriminatory
11	process to match the information contained in the voter
12	registration election management system with the database of
13	the motor vehicle division of the taxation and revenue
14	department or the federal social security administration for
15	all electronic certificates of registration completed pursuant
16	to this section.
17	F. Electronically submitted certificate of
18	registration application forms shall retain the dates of
19	submission by the qualified elector and of acceptance by the
20	<u>county clerk.</u>
21	G. For purposes of deadlines contained in the
22	Election Code, the time and date of the submission by the
23	qualified elector shall be considered the time and date when
24	the certificate of registration is received by the county
25	<u>clerk.</u>

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1	H. The secretary of state shall ensure that the web
2	sites used for electronic voter registration are secure and
3	that the confidentiality of all users and the integrity of data
4	submitted are preserved."
5	SECTION 2. Section 1-5-30 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989,
6	Chapter 298, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
7	"1-5-30. SECRETARY OF STATEESTABLISHMENT OF STATEWIDE
8	COMPUTERIZED VOTER REGISTRATION SYSTEM
9	A. The secretary of state shall develop, implement,
10	establish and supervise a statewide computerized voter
11	registration system that complies with the federal Help America
12	Vote Act of 2002 to facilitate voter registration and to
13	provide a central database containing voter registration
14	information for New Mexico.
15	B. The statewide computerized voter registration
16	system shall:
17	(1) provide for the establishment and
18	maintenance of a central database for all voter registration
19	information;
20	(2) permit the offices of all county clerks to
21	add, modify and delete county information from the system to
22	provide for accurate and up-to-date records;
23	(3) permit the offices of the county clerks
24	and the bureau of elections to have access to the central
25	database for review and search capabilities;
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1	(4) provide security and protection for all
2	information in the central database and monitor the central
3	database to ensure the prevention of unauthorized entry;
4	(5) provide procedures for the electronic
5	receipt of voter registration application and update
6	information, including digitized and electronic signatures,
7	photographs and other data provided by the motor vehicle
8	division of the taxation and revenue department or the federal
9	social security administration;
10	[(5)] <u>(6)</u> provide procedures for entering data
11	into the central database; and
12	[(6)] <u>(7)</u> provide a centralized system for
13	each county to enter the precinct to which a voter should be
14	assigned for voting purposes."
15	SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
16	provisions of this act is July 1, 2015.
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
