A MEMORIAL REQUESTING THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS, THE

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REQUESTING THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS, THE
NEW MEXICO ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES AND THE CURRY COUNTY COURT
COMPLIANCE DEPARTMENT TO STUDY THE TRANSFER OF COUNTY
EMPLOYEES TO THE MAGISTRATE COURTS TO OPERATE COMPLIANCE
PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, under current New Mexico law, certain offenders are sentenced to terms of probation with specific probation conditions; and

11 WHEREAS, county governments have employed individuals to 12 work with the magistrate courts in the capacity of court 13 compliance officers; and

WHEREAS, the duties and responsibilities of court compliance officers include monitoring certain offenders convicted of misdemeanors, including pre- and post-sentencing reports, residential and employment visits and collection of program costs; and

19 WHEREAS, the county compliance employees are not hired,20 trained or supervised by the courts; and

21 WHEREAS, counties have independent hours of operation 22 and different rules, procedures and requirements than the 23 courts; and

24 WHEREAS, county rules for employees, including25 compliance officers, may be inconsistent with the

SM 89 Page 1 1 requirements necessary to monitor the conditions of 2 probation; and

WHEREAS, the fees collected by the county compliance employees are used to fund operations of the county compliance operations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE 6 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the administrative office of the 7 8 courts, the New Mexico association of counties and the Curry county court compliance department be requested to 9 study the ramifications of the transfer of county employees 10 to the magistrate courts to operate compliance programs and 11 possible fiscal systems in which program costs collected by 12 compliance officers are deposited into a nonreverting fund 13 created in the state treasury to be administered by the 14 administrative office of the courts to fund compliance 15 operations and propose legislation to the legislative finance 16 committee and any other appropriate interim legislative 17 committee not later than October 1, 2015; and 18

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the co-chairs of the New Mexico legislative council, the administrative office of the courts, the New Mexico association of counties and the Curry county court compliance department.

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
