#### **SUMMARY**

## Synopsis of Bill

HB 589 provides for a distribution from the Law Enforcement Protection Fund to certified regional law enforcement training facilities and the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy for training. The academy and each regional facility shall be entitled to a rate of distribution of \$50 thousand which may be used only for basic, advanced, or in-service law enforcement training and for the purchase of equipment directly related to that training.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

<sup>\*</sup>Under current law, these funds would revert to the general fund.

### House Bill 589 – Page 2

This bill would distribute \$50 thousand to the eight regional training academies and \$50 thousand to the state Law Enforcement Academy. Under current distribution rates, \$4.5 million was reverted from the law enforcement protection fund in FY14 to the general fund. Approximately \$450 thousand less would be reverted to the general fund annually.

## **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

DPS stated that the bill will have a positive impact on the 9 law enforcement academies in New Mexico, including the DPS LEA. While all 9 law enforcement academies in NM have established their basic training programs, this bill allows the academies to expand additional training offerings that could be taught for the surrounding agencies and or it will assist the law enforcement academy's to purchase much needed equipment that can be used for both basic and advanced training for years to come.
