#### **SUMMARY**

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 344 appropriates \$150 thousand from the general fund to the Local Government Division (LGD) of the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) in FY16 to improve and expand early childhood education programs in Colfax, Guadalupe, Harding, Mora, Quay, San Miguel, and Taos counties.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$150 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2016 shall revert to the general fund.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Generally, bills containing location-specific appropriations may be in violation of the Antidonation Clause of the New Mexico Constitution or at risk for veto.

CYFD notes that quality early childhood education programs can provide an excellent foundation for success in later life.
