WHEREAS, Laura pursued her love of learning throughout her life, receiving numerous grants and awards; and

WHEREAS, while in Los Alamos, Laura and Eugene were involved in establishing Bethlehem Evangelical Lutheran church; and

WHEREAS, Los Alamos provided an opportunity for Laura to continue her interest in sports, where she learned to ski and play golf and began running again, leading to competing in senior olympics events at the local and national levels; and

WHEREAS, Laura and Eugene moved to Las Cruces in 1983; and WHEREAS, at age ninety-three, Laura competed in the 2013 national senior games with more than twenty-two thousand other seniors, winning medals in three swimming events; and
