BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: SECTION 1. Section 61-5A-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 55, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read: "61-5A-2. PURPOSE.--

In the interest of the public health, safety and 7 Α. welfare and to protect the public from the improper, 8 9 unprofessional, incompetent and unlawful practice of dentistry, dental therapy and dental hygiene, it is necessary to provide 10 laws and rules controlling the granting and use of the 11 12 privilege to practice dentistry, <u>dental therapy</u> and dental hygiene and to establish a board of dental health care and a 13 dental hygienists committee to implement and enforce those laws 14 and rules. 15

B. The primary duties of the New Mexico board of dental health care are:

(1) to issue licenses to qualified dentists,
 <u>dental therapists</u> and owners of dental practices;

(2) to certify qualified dental assistants, expanded-function dental auxiliaries and community dental health coordinators;

(3) to issue licenses to dental hygienists
through the dental hygienists committee;

(4) to discipline incompetent or

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1 unprofessional dentists, dental therapists, dental assistants, 2 owners of dental practices and, through the dental hygienists 3 committee, dental hygienists; and (5) to aid in the rehabilitation of impaired 4 5 dentists and dental hygienists for the purpose of protecting the public." 6 7 SECTION 2. Section 61-5A-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 55, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read: 8 9 "61-5A-3. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Dental Health Care 10 Act: "assessment" means the review and documentation 11 Α. 12 of the oral condition, and the recognition and documentation of deviations from the healthy condition, without a diagnosis to 13 determine the cause or nature of disease or its treatment; 14 "board" means the New Mexico board of dental 15 Β. health care: 16 "certified dental assistant" means an individual 17 C. certified by the dental assisting national board; 18 19 D. 9 [F.] H. "community dental health coordinator" means
a dental assistant, a dental hygienist or other trained
personnel certified by the board as a community dental health
coordinator to provide educational, preventive and limited
palliative care and assessment services working collaboratively
under the general supervision of a licensed dentist in settings
other than traditional dental offices and clinics;

[6.] I. "consulting dentist" means a dentist who has entered into an approved agreement to provide consultation and create protocols with a collaborating dental hygienist and, when required, to provide diagnosis and authorization for services, in accordance with the rules of the board and the committee;

[H.] J. "dental hygiene-focused assessment" means the documentation of existing oral and relevant system conditions and the identification of potential oral disease to develop, communicate, implement and evaluate a plan of oral .203211.1

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[<del>I.</del>] <u>K.</u> "dental assistant certified in expanded functions" means a dental assistant who meets specific qualifications set forth by rule of the board;

[J.] L. "dental hygienist" means an individual who has graduated and received a degree from a dental hygiene educational program that is accredited by the commission on dental accreditation, that provides a minimum of two academic years of dental hygiene curriculum and that is an institution of higher education; and "dental hygienist" means, except as the context otherwise requires, an individual who holds a license to practice dental hygiene in New Mexico;

[K.] M. "dental laboratory" means any place where dental restorative, prosthetic, cosmetic and therapeutic devices or orthodontic appliances are fabricated, altered or repaired by one or more persons under the orders and authorization of a dentist;

 $[\pm, ]$  <u>N</u>. "dental technician" means an individual, other than a licensed dentist, who fabricates, alters, repairs or assists in the fabrication, alteration or repair of dental restorative, prosthetic, cosmetic and therapeutic devices or orthodontic appliances under the orders and authorization of a dentist;

0. "dental therapist" means an individual who:
 (1) is licensed as a dental hygienist;

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1	(2) has provided, in accordance with board

3	and received a degree from a school of dental therapy that is					
4	accredited by the commission on dental accreditation; and					
5	(3) except as the context otherwise requires,					
6	is licensed to practice dental therapy in the state;

8	graduated and received a degree from a school of dentistry that					
9	is accredited by the commission on dental accreditation and,					
10	except as the context otherwise requires, who holds a license

12	$[N_{\bullet}]$ Q. "direct supervision" means the process					
13	under which an act is performed when a dentist licensed					
14	pursuant to the Dental Health Care Act:					
15	(1) is physically present throughout the					
16	performance of the act;					
17	(2) orders, controls and accepts full					
18	professional responsibility for the act performed; and					
19	(3) evaluates and approves the procedure					
20	performed before the patient departs the care setting;

22	a dental assistant, dental hygienist or other dental					
23	practitioner that has received education beyond that required

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expanded-function dental auxiliary who works under the direct 2 supervision of a dentist;

S. "federally qualified health center" means a 3 health facility that the United States department of health and 4 human services has deemed to qualify for federal funds as a 5 federally qualified health center; 6

7 т. "federally qualified health center look-alike facility" means a health facility that the federal centers for 8 medicare and medicaid services certifies as a federally 9 qualified health center look-alike facility; 10

[P.] U. "general supervision" means the authorization by a dentist of the procedures to be used by a dental therapist, community dental health coordinator, dental hygienist, dental assistant or dental student and the execution of the procedures in accordance with a dentist's diagnosis and treatment plan at a time the dentist is not physically present and in facilities as designated by rule of the board;

 $[Q_{\cdot}]$  V. "indirect supervision" means that a dentist, or in certain settings, a <u>dental therapist</u>, dental hygienist or dental assistant certified in expanded functions, is present in the treatment facility while authorized treatments are being performed by a <u>dental therapist</u>, dental hygienist, dental assistant or dental student;

W. "long-term care facility" means a nursing home licensed by the department of health to provide intermediate or .203211.1 - 7 -

[R.] X. "non-dentist owner" means an individual not
licensed as a dentist in New Mexico or a corporate entity not

 $[S_{\cdot}]$  <u>Y</u>. "palliative procedures" means nonsurgical, reversible procedures that are meant to alleviate pain and stabilize acute or emergent problems; and

"teledentistry" means a dentist's use of health information technology in real time to provide limited diagnostic and treatment planning services in cooperation with another dentist, <u>a dental therapist</u>, a dental hygienist, a community dental health coordinator or a student enrolled in a program of study to become a dental assistant, dental hygienist, dental therapist or dentist."

SECTION 3. Section 61-5A-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1994, Chapter 55, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-5A-5. LICENSE REQUIRED--EXEMPTIONS.--

A. Unless licensed to practice as a dentist under the Dental Health Care Act, no person shall:

(1) practice dentistry;

(2) use the title "dentist", "dental surgeon", "oral surgeon" or any other title, abbreviation, letters, figures, signs or devices that indicate the person is a .203211.1

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2 (3) perform any of the acts enumerated under
3 the definition of the practice of dentistry as defined in the
4 Dental Health Care Act.

B. The following, under the stipulations described, may practice dentistry or an area of dentistry without a New Mexico dental license:

8 (1) regularly licensed physicians or surgeons
9 are not prohibited from extracting teeth or treating any
10 disease coming within the province of the practice of medicine;

(2) New Mexico licensed dental hygienists and community dental health coordinators may provide those services within their scope of practice that are also within the scope of the practice of dentistry;

(3) any dental student duly enrolled in an accredited school of dentistry recognized by the board, while engaged in educational programs offered by the school in private offices, public clinics or educational institutions within the state of New Mexico under the indirect supervision of a licensed dentist;

(4) any dental hygiene or dental assisting student duly enrolled in an accredited school of dental hygiene or dental assisting engaged in procedures within or outside the scope of dental hygiene that are part of the curriculum of that program in the school setting and under the indirect

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supervision of a faculty member of the accredited program who is a licensed dentist, dental hygienist or dental assistant certified in the procedures being taught;

(5) unlicensed persons performing for a 4 5 licensed dentist merely mechanical work upon inert matter in the construction, making, alteration or repairing of any 6 7 artificial dental substitute, dental restorative or corrective 8 appliance, when the casts or impressions for the work have been 9 furnished by a licensed dentist and where the work is prescribed by a dentist pursuant to a written authorization by 10 that dentist: 11

(6) commissioned dental officers of the uniformed forces of the United States and dentists providing services to the United States public health service <u>commissioned corps</u>, the United States department of veterans affairs or within federally controlled facilities in the discharge of their official duties, provided that such persons who hold dental licenses in New Mexico shall be subject to the provisions of the Dental Health Care Act; [and]

(7) dental assistants performing adjunctive services to the provision of dental care, under the indirect supervision of a dentist, as determined by rule of the board if such services are not within the practice of dental hygiene as specifically listed in Subsection B of Section 61-5A-4 NMSA 1978, unless allowed in Subsection E of this section; .203211.1 - 10 -

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1	(8) any dental therapy student enrolled in an					
2	accredited school of dental therapy recognized by the board,					
3	while engaged in educational programs offered by the dental					
4	therapy school in private offices, public clinics or					
5	educational institutions within the state of New Mexico under

7	(9) a dental therapist who is licensed in New

11	C. Unless licensed to practice as a dental					
12	hygienist under the Dental Health Care Act, no person shall:					
13	(1) practice as a dental hygienist;					
14	(2) use the title "dental hygienist" or					
15	abbreviation "R.D.H." or any other title, abbreviation,					
16	letters, figures, signs or devices that indicate the person is					
17	a licensed dental hygienist; or					
18	(3) perform any of the acts defined as the					
19	practice of dental hygiene in the Dental Health Care Act.					
20	D. The following, under the stipulations described,					
21	may practice dental hygiene or the area of dental hygiene					
22	outlined without a New Mexico dental hygiene license:					
23	(1) students enrolled in an accredited dental					
24	hygiene program engaged in procedures that are part of the					
25	curriculum of that program and under the indirect supervision					
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1 of a licensed faculty member of the accredited program; 2 (2) dental assistants and community dental 3 health coordinators working under general supervision who: expose dental radiographs after 4 (a) 5 being certified in expanded functions by the board; (b) perform rubber cup coronal 6 7 polishing, which is not represented as a prophylaxis, having 8 satisfied the educational requirements as established by rules 9 of the board; (c) apply fluorides as established by 10 rules of the board; and 11 12 (d) perform those other dental hygienist functions as recommended to the board by the committee and set 13 forth by rule of the board; and 14 dental assistants certified in expanded (3) 15 functions, working under the indirect supervision of a dental 16 hygienist certified for collaborative practice and under the 17 protocols established in a collaborative practice agreement 18 19 with a consulting dentist. 20 Ε. Dental assistants working under the indirect supervision of a dentist and in accordance with the rules and 21 regulations established by the board may: 22 expose dental radiographs; (1) 23 perform rubber cup coronal polishing that (2) 24 is not represented as a prophylaxis; 25 .203211.1 - 12 -

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1 apply fluoride and pit and fissure (3) 2 sealants without mechanical alteration of the tooth: 3 (4) perform those other dental hygienist functions as recommended to the board by the committee and set 4 forth by rule of the board; and 5 perform such other related functions that 6 (5) 7 are not expressly prohibited by statute or rules of the board. F. A community dental health coordinator working 8 9 under the general supervision of a dentist and in accordance with the rules established by the board may: 10 (1) place temporary and sedative restorative 11 12 material in unexcavated carious lesions and unprepared tooth fractures; 13 collect and transmit diagnostic data and 14 (2)images via telemetric connection; 15 dispense and apply medications on the 16 (3) specific order of a dentist; 17 provide limited palliative procedures for (4) 18 19 dental emergencies in consultation with a supervising dentist 20 as allowed by the rules the board has promulgated; and perform other related functions for which (5) 21 the community dental health coordinator meets training and 22 educational standards established by the board and that are not 23 expressly prohibited by statute or rules promulgated by the 24 25 board. .203211.1

Unless licensed as a dentist or non-dentist 2 owner, or as otherwise exempt from the licensing requirements of the Dental Health Care Act, no individual or corporate 3 entity shall: 4 employ or contract with a dentist or 5 (1)dental hygienist for the purpose of providing dental or dental 6 7 hygiene services as defined by their respective scopes of practice; or 8 9 (2) enter into a managed care or other agreement to provide dental or dental hygiene services in New 10 Mexico. 11 12 н. The following, under stipulations described, may function as a non-dentist owner without a New Mexico license: 13 (1) 14 government agencies providing dental services within affiliated facilities; 15 (2) government agencies engaged in providing 16 public health measures to prevent dental disease; 17 spouses of deceased licensed dentists or (3) 18 19 dental hygienists for a period of one year following the death 20 of the licensee; accredited schools of dentistry, dental (4) 21 hygiene and dental assisting providing dental services solely 22 in an educational setting; 23 dental hygienists licensed in New Mexico (5) 24 or corporate entities with a majority interest owned by a 25 .203211.1 - 14 -

J. establish ad hoc committees whose members shall be appointed by the chair with the advice and consent of the board or committee and shall include at least one member of the board or committee as it deems necessary for carrying on its business;

K. have the authority to pay per diem and mileage to individuals who are appointed by the board or the committee to serve on ad hoc committees;

L. have the authority to hire or contract with investigators to investigate possible violations of the Dental Health Care Act and the Dental Amalgam Waste Reduction Act;

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subpoenas prior to the issuance of a notice of contemplated action for the purpose of investigating complaints against dentists, <u>dental therapists</u>, dental assistants and, through the committee, dental hygienists licensed under the Dental Health Care Act and the Dental Amalgam Waste Reduction Act;

N. have the authority to sue or be sued and to retain the services of an attorney at law for counsel and representation regarding the carrying out of the board's duties;

0. have the authority to create and maintain a formulary, in consultation with the board of pharmacy, of medications that a <u>dental therapist or</u> dental hygienist may prescribe, administer or dispense in accordance with rules the board has promulgated; and

P. establish continuing education or continued competency requirements for dentists, <u>dental therapists</u>, certified dental assistants in expanded functions, dental technicians and, through the committee, dental hygienists."

24	A. [ <del>Any dentist or dental hygienist</del> ] <u>A licensee</u> who					
25	wishes to retire from [ <del>the</del> ] practice [ <del>of dentistry or dental</del>					
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1 hygiene] shall meet all requirements for retirement as set by 2 rules of the board, and, if the licensee is a dental hygienist, 3 the committee. The licensee shall notify the board or the committee in writing before the expiration of the licensee's 4 current license, and the secretary of the board or the 5 committee shall acknowledge the receipt of notice and record 6 7 [the same] it. If, within a period of three years from the 8 date of retirement, the [dentist or dental hygienist] licensee 9 wishes to resume practice, the applicant shall [so] notify the board or the committee in writing and give proof of completing 10 all requirements as prescribed by rules of the board and the 11 12 committee to reactivate the license.

B. At any time during the three-year period following retirement, a [dentist or dental hygienist] licensee with a retired New Mexico license may request in writing to the board or the committee that [his] the licensee's license be placed in inactive status. Upon the receipt of the application and fees as determined by the board or the committee and with the approval of the board or the committee, the license may be placed in inactive status.

C. A licensee whose license has been placed in inactive status may not engage in any of the activities contained within the scope of practice of dentistry, <u>dental</u> <u>therapy</u> or dental hygiene in New Mexico described in [<del>Section</del> <del>61-5A-4 NMSA 1978</del>] <u>the Dental Health Care Act</u>.

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D. Licensees with inactive licenses must renew their licenses triennially and comply with all the requirements set by the board and, <u>if the licensee is a dental hygienist</u>, by the committee.

Ε. If a licensee with an inactive license wishes to 5 resume [the] active practice [of dentistry or dental hygiene], 6 7 the licensee must notify the board or, if the licensee is a dental hygienist, the committee, in writing and provide proof 8 9 of completion of all requirements to reactivate the license as prescribed by rule of the board or the committee. Upon payment 10 of all fees due, the board may reactivate the license and the 11 12 licensee may resume [the] practice [of dentistry or dental hygiene] subject to any stipulations of the board or the 13 14 committee.

F. Inactive licenses must be reactivated or permanently retired within nine years of having been placed in inactive status.

G. Assessment of fees pursuant to this section is not subject to the Uniform Licensing Act."

"61-5A-19. REINSTATEMENT OF REVOKED OR SUSPENDED LICENSE.--

Consistent with the federal act and subject to the appropriation and availability of federal and state funds, the medical assistance division of the department may by rule provide medical assistance, including the services of licensed doctors of oriental medicine, licensed chiropractic physicians, licensed dental therapists and licensed dental .203211.1

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hygienists in collaborating practice, to persons eligible for public assistance programs under the federal act.

3 Subject to appropriation and availability of Β. federal, state or other funds received by the state from 4 public or private grants or donations, the medical assistance 5 division of the department may by rule provide medical 6 7 assistance, including assistance in the payment of premiums for medical or long-term care insurance, to children up to the 8 9 age of twelve if not part of a sibling group; children up to the age of eighteen if part of a sibling group that includes a 10 child up to the age of twelve; and pregnant women who are 11 12 residents of the state of New Mexico and who are ineligible for public assistance under the federal act. The department, 13 14 in implementing the provisions of this subsection, shall:

(1) establish rules that encourage pregnantwomen to participate in prenatal care; and

(2) not provide a benefit package that exceeds the benefit package provided to state employees."

SECTION 18. Section 59A-47-28.4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, Chapter 343, Section 4) is amended to read:

"59A-47-28.4. COVERAGE FOR COLLABORATIVE PRACTICE--<u>DENTAL THERAPISTS</u>--DENTAL HYGIENISTS.--An individual or group subscriber contract delivered or issued for delivery in New Mexico that, on a prepaid, service or indemnity basis, provides for treatment of persons for the prevention, cure or .203211.1

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correction of any illness or physical or mental condition shall include coverage for the services of a <u>dental therapist</u> <u>and a</u> dental hygienist in a collaborative practice pursuant to the Dental Health Care Act."

SECTION 19. TEMPORARY PROVISION.--The department of health shall conduct an outcome report on the first five years of dental therapy practice in the state pursuant to this act. At a date five years following the date of the first issuance of a license to practice dental therapy in the state, the department of health shall consult with the New Mexico board of dental health care, the New Mexico dental hygienists' association and the New Mexico dental association to compile and issue a report to the legislative health and human services committee of the department's findings and recommendations regarding dental therapy, including: A. its efficacy, effectiveness and cost;

B. its impact on access to dental health care;C. the distribution of dental therapistsstatewide;

D. demographic representation among dental therapists;

E. issues related to supervision of dental therapists and their scope of practice;

F. evaluation of services delivered under indirect supervision for recommendation to general supervision; and .203211.1

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
