#### **SUMMARY**

### Synopsis of Bill

The bill appropriates \$400.0 from the General Fund to Eastern New Mexico University (ENMU) to manage a program for grade school and high school students to design, build, program and test autonomous robots and to sponsor an international robot competition in New Mexico.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Because the bill provides for an annual international robot competition, the appropriation is considered recurring.
