SUMMARY

Synopsis of House Health Committee Amendment

House Health Committee amends House Memorial 71 to expand the working group of experts to include "providers of home health care, behavioral health services or services for people with disabilities and any other interested stakeholders."

Synopsis of Original Bill

House Memorial 71 would require the Human Services Department to convene a working group of stakeholders to address measures to ensure individuals receiving Medicaid benefits, particularly those with chronic illnesses or behavioral or developmental disabilities or who receive home health care, are actually receiving benefits.

HSD would further be required to make findings and recommendations to the Legislative Health and Human Services Committee regarding a plan to verify delivery of services to Medicaid recipients.
