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AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE EXPENDITURES; REDUCING LEGISLATIVE
APPROPRIATIONS IN LAWS 2016, CHAPTER 1; ENACTING A NEW
SECTION OF THE GENERAL APPROPRIATION ACT OF 2016 TO REDUCE
CERTAIN GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017;
MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE BRANCH APPROPRIATION 9 10 REDUCTIONS.--The appropriations made from the general fund in Laws 2016, Chapter 1, Sections 3 through 8 are reduced by 11 three percent rounded to the nearest one hundred dollars 12 To meet the reductions required by this section and 13 (\$100). maintain government efficiency, the New Mexico legislative 14 15 council shall determine the amount of reduction applied to 16 each legislative agency and purpose and may transfer amounts from any of the appropriations in Laws 2016, Chapter 1 to any 17 other legislative appropriation where they may be amended. 18

SECTION 2. A new section of the General AppropriationAct of 2016 is enacted to read:

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"APPROPRIATION REDUCTIONS .--

A. Except as provided in Subsections B through J of this section, all amounts set out under the general fund column in Section 4 of the General Appropriation Act of 2016 are reduced by five and one-half percent rounded to the

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nearest one hundred dollars (\$100).

Β. The general fund appropriations in Section 4 of 2 3 the General Appropriation Act of 2016 for the university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university, New Mexico highlands 4 university, western New Mexico university, eastern New Mexico 5 university, New Mexico institute of mining and technology, 6 northern New Mexico college, Santa Fe community college, 7 8 central New Mexico community college, Luna community college, Mesalands community college, New Mexico junior college, 9 San Juan college, Clovis community college, New Mexico 10 military institute, New Mexico school for the blind and 11 visually impaired and New Mexico school for the deaf are 12 reduced by five percent rounded to the nearest one hundred 13 dollars (\$100). The reductions provided for in this 14 subsection shall be prioritized to the non-instructional 15 expenditures of the educational institutions. 16

C. The general fund appropriations in Section 4 of 17 the General Appropriation Act of 2016 to the supreme court 18 law library, judicial standards commission, court of appeals, 19 supreme court, administrative office of the courts, supreme 20 court building commission, district courts, Bernalillo county 21 metropolitan court, district attorneys, administrative office 22 of the district attorneys and public defender department are 23 reduced by three percent rounded to the nearest one hundred 24 dollars (\$100). 25

1 D. The general fund appropriations in Section 4 of 2 the General Appropriation Act of 2016 to the following are 3 reduced by two and one-half percent rounded to the nearest one hundred dollars (\$100): 4 legislative building services; and 5 (1)(2) for the human services department: 6 program support; (a) 7 8 (b) the child support enforcement program; 9 the income support program; and (c) 10 (d) the behavioral health services 11 12 program. Ε. The general fund appropriations in Section 4 of 13 the General Appropriation Act of 2016 to the following 14 programs of the corrections department are reduced by one and 15 one-half percent rounded to the nearest one hundred dollars 16 (\$100): 17 the inmate management and control (1) 18 program; 19 (2) the community offender management 20 program; and 21 (3) program support. 22 The general fund appropriations in Section 4 of F. 23 the General Appropriation Act of 2016 to the following are 24 not reduced: 25 SB 9 Page 3

1 (1) for the human services department: 2 the medical assistance program; and (a) 3 (b) medicaid behavioral health program; for the department of health: (2) 4 the facilities management program; 5 (a) (b) the developmental disabilities 6 support program; and 7 (c) 8 contracts for sexual assault services and prevention in the epidemiology and response 9 10 program; (3) the veterans' services department; 11 (4) the children, youth and families 12 department; 13 (5) the department of public safety; 14 (6) for the legislative council service, the 15 energy council dues; and 16 (7) for the public education department, the 17 special appropriations made in Subparagraphs (e), (j) and 18 (k). 19 G. The general fund appropriations in Section 4 of 20 the General Appropriation Act of 2016 to the following are 21 reduced as follows: 22 (1) public education department special 23 appropriations made in Subparagraphs (a) through (d), (f) 24 through (i) and (l) through (t) are reduced by twenty-two 25 SB 9

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million dollars (\$22,000,000) in the aggregate;

2 the state equalization guarantee (2) 3 distribution for public school support is reduced by thirtyseven million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$37,800,000); 4 provided that the secretary of public education shall set the 5 final unit value one and one-half percent lower than the 6 preliminary unit value by December 15, 2016 to account for 7 8 the reduction provided for in this paragraph, and the reduction shall be prioritized to the non-instructional 9 expenditures of the school districts and charter schools, and 10 for fiscal year 2017, if the program cost made available is 11 insufficient to meet the level of state support required by 12 the special education maintenance of effort requirements of 13 Part B of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education 14 Act, the public education department may reduce the state 15 equalization guarantee distribution in an amount that equals 16 the projected shortfall and distribute that amount to school 17 districts and charter schools in the same manner and on the 18 same basis as the state equalization guarantee distribution 19 to meet the level of support required by Part B of the 20 federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act for 21 fiscal year 2017; and 22

(3) the transportation distribution, supplemental distribution, instructional material fund, dualcredit instructional materials, Indian education fund and SB 9

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standards-based assessments are reduced by thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000) in the aggregate.

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H. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Public School Finance Act and the Instructional Material Law, the use of cash balances derived from general fund appropriations for instructional materials and school transportation made in fiscal year 2016 and previous fiscal years shall not be restricted in fiscal year 2017 and may be transferred to the operational fund. The public education department shall provide the legislative finance committee and the legislative education study committee with a report on the amount spent and transferred from the cash balances.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Public I. 13 School Capital Improvements Act and the Public School 14 Buildings Act, property tax revenue generated from an 15 election pursuant to these acts in fiscal year 2017 or 16 previous fiscal years or cash balances derived from property 17 taxes imposed pursuant to these acts in previous fiscal years 18 may be used for any purpose; provided that, if a new purpose 19 is designated that does not conform with the original 20 resolution, a new resolution shall be submitted to the 21 qualified electors prior to repurposing any property tax 22 revenue imposed pursuant to the acts. 23

J. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Instructional Material Law, a school district or charter

1 school may use up to one hundred percent of its 2017 2 instructional material allocation or cash balances derived 3 from prior allocations for instructional materials and other classroom materials without restrictions on the use of funds 4 established in Subsection C of Section 22-15-9 NMSA 1978; 5 provided that the funds are used for instructional materials 6 and other classroom materials as defined in Section 22-15-2 7 8 NMSA 1978."

9 SECTION 3. A new section of the General Appropriation10 Act of 2016 is enacted to read:

"OPERATING BUDGETS AND ALLOTMENTS REDUCED TO COMPLY --11 DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION .-- The department of 12 finance and administration and, for legislative branch 13 reductions, the New Mexico legislative council shall reduce 14 fiscal year 2017 operating budgets and adjust allotments to 15 comply with the provisions of this 2016 act and may reduce 16 appropriations from other state funds, internal 17 service/interagency transfers and federal funds as necessary 18 to match the general fund reductions in the fiscal year 2017 19 operating budgets. The legislative finance committee shall 20 review the adjusted operating budgets in a timely manner." 21 SECTION 4. TEMPORARY PROVISION--REPORTS.--The

22 SECTION 4. TEMPORARY PROVISION--REPORTS.--The 23 department of finance and administration, the higher 24 education department for public post-secondary educational 25 institutions and special schools and the public education

1 department for public schools shall report the new operating 2 budgets, including allotment adjustments, to the New Mexico 3 legislative council, the legislative finance committee and the legislative education study committee on the 4 implementation of this act for state government, public post-5 secondary educational institutions and public schools. 6 Reports, including new operating budgets, shall be published 7 8 on the departments' websites.

9 SECTION 5. TEMPORARY PROVISION--FISCAL YEAR 2017- 10 BUDGET ADJUSTMENT REQUESTS--PUBLIC POST-SECONDARY EDUCATIONAL
 11 INSTITUTIONS.--

A. For fiscal year 2017, upon approval of the 12 higher education department and review of the legislative 13 finance committee, the state budget division of the 14 department of finance and administration may approve a budget 15 adjustment request to transfer money to the category of 16 instruction and general purposes of up to twenty-five percent 17 of the following appropriations made pursuant to the General 18 Appropriation Act of 2016: 19

(1) from an appropriation to a university,
community college, branch campus or other institution
identified in Subsection C of this section, in the category
of appropriations classified as other;

(2) from an appropriation to a university,community college, branch campus or other institution

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identified in Subsection C of this section, for research and 1 2 public service projects or athletics; 3 (3) from an appropriation to a university identified in Paragraphs (1) through (5) of Subsection C of 4 this section, for instructional television; and 5 (4) from an appropriation to a branch campus 6 of a university identified in Paragraphs (1) through (4) of 7 Subsection C of this section or to an institution identified 8 in Paragraphs (6) through (13) of Subsection C of this 9 section, for any purpose excluding instructional and general 10 purposes. 11 B. The higher education department shall not 12 approve a budget adjustment request to transfer money from an 13 appropriation for a state agency or program administered by a 14 university identified in Paragraphs (1) through (5) of 15 Subsection C of this section. 16 C. The provisions of this section apply to the 17 following post-secondary educational institutions: 18 (1)the university of New Mexico, including 19 each of its branch campuses; 20 (2) New Mexico state university, including 21 each of its branch campuses; 22 (3) New Mexico highlands university, 23 including each of its branch campuses; 24 (4) eastern New Mexico university, including 25 SB 9 Page 9

1 each of its branch campuses; 2 (5) the New Mexico institute of mining and 3 technology; (6) northern New Mexico college; 4 5 (7) Santa Fe community college; (8) central New Mexico community college; 6 (9) Luna community college; 7 8 (10) Mesalands community college; (11) New Mexico junior college; 9 (12) San Juan college; 10 Clovis community college; and (13) 11 (14) the New Mexico military institute. 12 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION.--One million dollars 13 (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the 14 department of finance and administration for expenditure in 15 fiscal year 2017 for distribution with approval of the state 16 board of finance to agencies experiencing hardships in fiscal 17 year 2017 resulting from reductions made in this act. The 18 department of finance and administration shall report to the 19 legislative finance committee and the legislative education 20 study committee on expenditures made from this appropriation. 21 Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end 22 of fiscal year 2017 shall revert to the general fund._____ SB 9 23 Page 10 24

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
