12	ACT; EXPANDING THE REQUIREMENTS THAT APPLY TO COMMERCIAL
13	TRANSACTIONS INVOLVING PRECIOUS METAL ITEMS; PROVIDING
14	PENALTIES; REPEALING SECTIONS OF THE NMSA 1978.
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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLESections 1
18	through 7 of this act may be cited as the "Precious Metal
19	Transactions Act".
20	SECTION 2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DEFINITIONSAs used in the
21	Precious Metal Transactions Act:
22	A. "dealer" means an owner or employee of a
23	commercial establishment that conducts transactions involving
24	precious metal items;
25	B. "precious metal" means gold, silver or platinum;
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and

C. "transaction" means a purchase, sale, appraisal or loan.

SECTION 3. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] WEIGHING PRECIOUS METAL.--In conducting a transaction involving a precious metal item, a dealer weighing the item shall use as a scale only one that a weights and measures officer of New Mexico, within twelve months before the date of the measurement, has inspected and approved for use.

SECTION 4. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] PRECIOUS METAL TRANSACTION--PATRON IDENTIFICATION--RECEIPT--RECEIPT RETENTION.--

A. For each purchase or appraisal of a precious metal item by a dealer, the dealer shall require the patron involved in the transaction to present a valid, governmentissued photo identification card.

B. For each purchase or appraisal of a precious metal item by a dealer, the dealer shall issue to the patron involved in the transaction a serialized receipt or statement of appraisal, as appropriate, that shows:

(1) the legal name and address of the commercial establishment;

(2) if the transaction is a purchase, the name and address of the seller;

(3) the date of the transaction;

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(4) the net weight in terms of pounds troy or

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1 avoirdupois, ounces troy or avoirdupois, pennyweight troy or 2 avoirdupois or kilograms or grams; and (5) the fineness of the precious metal in 3 terms of karat for gold and sterling or coin for silver. 4 5 C. A dealer shall retain for at least one year a copy of every receipt and statement of appraisal that 6 7 Subsection B of this section requires the dealer to issue. [NEW MATERIAL] RECORD--REPORT.--8 SECTION 5. 9 Α. Except for a direct purchase from a permit holder regulated by the Pawnbrokers Act who has already 10 reported the item in accordance with this section, a dealer 11 12 shall accurately record each transaction involving a precious metal item that occurs at the dealer's commercial 13 14 establishment: on a form approved by a local law 15 (1)enforcement agency in the jurisdiction in which the transaction 16 occurred; and 17 no later than noon on the day after the 18 (2) 19 transaction. 20 Β. The dealer shall complete a form for each item transacted. The record shall include: 21 identification and a description of the (1)22 23 item; (2) the serial number and identifying marks of 24 25 the item, if any; .204359.1 - 3 -

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1	(3) the time and date of the transaction;
2	(4) the name and address of the patron
3	involved in the transaction;
4	(5) a description, including the sex,
5	complexion, hair color, approximate height, approximate weight
6	and date of birth, of the patron;
7	(6) the type of identification, as required by
8	Subsection A of Section 4 of the Precious Metal Transactions
9	Act, that the patron presented; and
10	(7) the identifying number of that
11	identification and the state and date of issuance, if any.
12	C. A dealer shall deliver or mail the record
13	required by this section to the local law enforcement agency
14	within three days after the transaction.
15	SECTION 6. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ITEM TAGITEM HOLDRECORD AND
16	ITEM INSPECTION
17	A. A precious metal dealer shall attach a tag to
18	every item for which a record is required by Section 5 of the
19	Precious Metal Transactions Act. The tag shall display
20	alphabetic or numeric symbols that match the item to the record
21	to which it corresponds.
22	B. A dealer who purchases a precious metal item
23	from a seller other than a licensed pawnbroker, a second-hand
24	store or another dealer shall, for at least fifteen days,
25	retain the precious metal in the form that the dealer purchased
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it.

2 C. A dealer shall make available for inspection by the local government authority, the attorney general, a local 3 law enforcement agency in the jurisdiction in which the 4 transaction occurred or a sworn member of the law enforcement 5 6 agency: 7 (1) the record required by Section 5 of the Precious Metal Transactions Act: and 8 9 (2) the items required by this section to be held. 10 [NEW MATERIAL] PENALTY .--SECTION 7. 11 12 A person who violates the Precious Metal Α. 13 Transactions Act is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be 14 sentenced in accordance with Section 31-19-1 NMSA 1978. Upon a person's second or subsequent conviction 15 B. for a violation of the Precious Metal Transactions Act, the 16 person is guilty of a fourth degree felony and shall be 17 sentenced in accordance with Section 31-18-15 NMSA 1978. 18 19 SECTION 8. Section 57-9-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967, 20 Chapter 155, Section 1) is amended to read: SHORT TITLE.--[This act] Chapter 57, Article 9 21 "57-9-1.
