HOUSE STATE GOVERNMENT, INDIAN AND VETERANS AFFAIRS COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL 254

53RD LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - FIRST SESSION, 2017

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE GAME COMMISSION; PROVIDING FOR THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO APPOINT FOUR COMMISSIONERS; SETTING TERM LIMITS FOR COMMISSIONERS; ADDING REQUIREMENTS FOR APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL OF COMMISSIONERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 17-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1921, Chapter 35, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

"17-1-2. STATE GAME COMMISSION--APPOINTMENT--TERM.--

A. To carry out the purpose of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 and all other acts for like purpose, there is created a "state game commission" of seven members. [not more than four of whom shall be of the same political party at the time of their appointment. The]

B. Three members of the commission shall be .206416.5

1	appointed by the governor, <u>no two residing in the same</u>
2	congressional district, and no more than two affiliated with
3	the same political party.
4	C. Four members of the commission shall be
5	appointed by the New Mexico legislative council. Those four
6	appointees shall consist of:
7	(1) one representative from the non-
8	consumptive outdoor recreation conservation community;
9	(2) one representative from the hunting and
10	fishing community, as evidenced by holding a current valid
11	hunting or fishing license and having held a valid hunting or
12	fishing license each of the previous four years;
13	(3) one representative from the agricultural
14	community, as evidenced by owning or managing a farm or ranch;
15	<u>and</u>
16	(4) one scientist specializing in biology,
17	ecology or wildlife management from a state educational
18	institution.
19	D. Other than the scientist appointed pursuant to
20	Paragraph (4) of Subsection C of this section:
21	(1) no more than two of the commissioners
22	appointed by the New Mexico legislative council shall be
23	affiliated with the same political party; and
24	(2) a person shall not be eligible to be
25	appointed as a commissioner if the person changed party
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affiliation during the previous four years.

E. All commissioners shall be appointed with the advice and consent of the senate. The term of office for each member of the commission shall be [four] six years, except as provided in this subsection. At the time of making the governor's first three appointments pursuant to this 2017 act, the governor shall designate [the commissioners' terms as being one, two, three or four years so that the term of no more than two commissioners shall expire each year.

In making appointments to the state game commission, one member shall be appointed from each of the following districts:

A. district one: Curry, De Baca, Roosevelt, Chaves, Lincoln, Otero, Eddy and Lea counties;

B. district two: Catron, Socorro, Grant, Hidalgo,
Luna, Sierra and Dona Ana counties;

C. district three: San Juan, McKinley, Cibola, Valencia, Sandoval, Los Alamos and Rio Arriba counties;

D. district four: Santa Fe, Taos, Colfax, Union,
Mora, Harding, Quay, San Miguel, Guadalupe and Torrance
counties; and

E. district five: Bernalillo county. The remaining two members shall be appointed at-large. At least one member of the commission shall manage and operate a farm or ranch that contains at least two species of wildlife on that part which is deeded land requiring licensing prior to legal

2	least one member shall have a demonstrated history of
3	involvement in wildlife and habitat protection issues and whose
4	activities or occupation are not in conflict with wildlife and
5	habitat advocacy.] one commissioner to serve a two-year term,
6	one commissioner to serve a four-year term and one commissioner
7	to serve a six-year term. At the time of making the New Mexico
8	legislative council's first four appointments, the council
9	shall designate:
10	(1) the representative of the conservation
11	community to serve a two-year term;

community to serve a two-year term;

(2) the representative of the hunting and fishing community to serve a four-year term;

(3) the representative of the agricultural community to serve a six-year term; and

(4) the scientist to serve a six-year term.

F. An appointed commissioner shall serve and have all of the duties, responsibilities and authority of that office during the period of time prior to final action by the senate confirming or rejecting the commissioner's appointment.

G. Commissioners shall serve for no more than two terms. A partial term shall be counted as one full term.

H. When a commissioner dies, resigns or no longer meets the qualifications required for the commissioner's original selection, that position on the commission

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becomes vacant. The original appointing authority for the
vacant position shall appoint a successor for the remainder of
the term in the same manner as the original selection for that
position was made.

I. A commissioner shall not be removed except for incompetence, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office; provided, however, that no removal shall be made without notice of hearing and an opportunity to be heard having first been given to the commissioner. The supreme court of the state of New Mexico is hereby given exclusive original jurisdiction over proceedings to remove commissioners under such rules as it may promulgate, and its decision in connection with such matters shall be final.

J. The state game commission as provided in Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 shall have the same authority, powers and duties as now vested in the state game commission by law [and each member of the state game commission shall serve until his successor has been appointed and qualified]."

SECTION 2. [NEW MATERIAL] INITIAL APPOINTMENTS.--The governor and the New Mexico legislative council shall make their initial appointments to the state game commission pursuant to the provisions of Section 1 of this 2017 act to be effective on January 1, 2019, at which time the terms of currently serving commissioners are terminated. A person who served as a commissioner prior to January 1, 2019 is eligible

to be appointed only to one term commencing on January 1, 2019; provided that the person previously served no more than one term as a commissioner.

EFFECTIVE DATE.--SECTION 3.

- The effective date of the provisions of Section 1 of this act is January 1, 2019.
- The effective date of the provisions of Section 2 of this act is July 1, 2017.

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
