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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 61-6-31.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
19	Chapter 235, Section 6) is amended to read:

23	<u>A.</u> Pursuant to Subsection D of Section 61-6-31 NMSA
24	1978, by January 1, 2018, the board shall authorize
25	expenditures from unexpended and unencumbered cash balances in
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1	the board of medical examiners fund to support an information
2	technology project manager [to develop, implement and maintain
3	a web site portal for licensure and a central database for
4	credentialing of health care providers]. The board shall
5	charge the information technology project manager with
6	developing, implementing and maintaining a publicly accessible
7	and searchable website portal for the posting of information
8	related to licensure and licensees, including licensee profile
9	information in accordance with Subsection B of this section and
10	the posting of each licensee's disciplinary history in
11	accordance with Subsection C of this section.
12	B. At a minimum, the board shall make each
13	licensee's profile on the board's website searchable by the
14	following factors relating to the licensee:
15	<u>(1)</u> name;
16	<u>(2) specialty;</u>
17	(3) location; and
18	(4) license number.
19	C. On a publicly accessible website, the board
20	shall post the following information about each licensee in
21	<u>plain language:</u>
22	(1) name, including any former names or
23	<u>aliases;</u>
24	(2) a photograph that is less than three years
25	old at the time of posting;
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1	(3) the type of license the licensee holds;
2	(4) any specialty of the licensee;
3	(5) criminal history;
4	(6) any formal disciplinary action, including

14	SECTION 2. A new section of the Osteopathic Medicine Act
15	is enacted to read:
