17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 30-9-19 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2006,
19	Chapter 104, Section 10) is amended to read:
20	"30-9-19. SEXUAL ASSAULT <u>LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY</u>
21	POLICIESSUBMISSION OF DNA SAMPLES BY LAW ENFORCEMENT AND
22	LABORATORIES
23	A. [Samples from] <u>By October 1, 2017, every law</u>
24	enforcement agency shall develop and implement a policy that:
25	(1) prescribes how the agency handles a sample
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1	of biological material collected pursuant to a medical
2	examination of a sexual assault victim that is received by the
3	agency;
4	(2) provides how the agency prioritizes a
5	sample for DNA testing by the agency's servicing laboratory;
6	and
7	(3) requires the agency to send a sample of
8	biological material collected pursuant to a medical examination
9	of a sexual assault victim [shall be submitted by the
10	investigating law enforcement agency] to that agency's
11	servicing laboratory for DNA testing <u>as soon as practicable</u>
12	after receiving the sample and, in all cases, within thirty
13	days of the agency's receipt of the sample.
14	<u>B.</u> Records derived from DNA testing that qualify
15	for insertion into CODIS shall be submitted by the servicing
16	laboratory to the administrative center.
17	<u>C. By November 1 of each year, a law enforcement</u>
18	agency's servicing laboratory shall report to the legislature
19	if, at the end of the immediately preceding fiscal year, the
20	laboratory had in its possession three hundred or more untested
21	samples of biological material collected pursuant to medical
22	examinations of sexual assault victims.
23	[B.] <u>D.</u> As used in this section:
24	(1) "administrative center" means the law
25	enforcement agency or unit that administers and operates the
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1	DNA identification system pursuant to the provisions of the DNA
2	Identification Act;
3	(2) "biological material" means material that
4	is derived from a human body and includes bodily fluids, hair
5	and skin cells;
6	(3) "CODIS" means the federal bureau of
7	investigation's <u>"combined DNA index system", a</u> national DNA
8	index system for storage and exchange of DNA records submitted
9	by forensic DNA laboratories;
10	(4) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid;
11	(5) "DNA testing" means a forensic DNA
12	analysis that includes restriction fragment length
13	polymorphism, polymerase chain reaction or other valid methods
14	of DNA typing performed to obtain identification
15	characteristics of samples; and
16	(6) "sample" means a sample of biological
17	material sufficient for DNA testing."
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
