#### **SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 6 appropriates \$400 thousand from the general fund to the Legislative Council Service for a professional study of the gross receipts tax structure in New Mexico to evaluate reform options and issue a report by August 31, 2017.

The bill declares an emergency.

#### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

The appropriation of \$400 thousand contained in this bill is a nonrecurring expense to the general fund. Expenditure is authorized in FY17 and FY18. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY18 shall revert to the general fund.

#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Senate Bill 6 calls for Legislative Council Service to contract with a professional economic research firm to estimate the gross receipts tax base and evaluate options for replacing or reforming the gross receipts tax.
