[B.] <u>C.</u> "eligible institution" means any [state] public institution of higher education in [New Mexico] any state in the United States;

[C.] <u>D.</u> "fire fighter" means any member of a fire department that is part of or administered by the state or any political subdivision of the state;

[D.] <u>E.</u> "peace officer" means any member of a police or sheriff's department that is part of or administered by the state or any political subdivision of the state and officers in the <u>corrections</u> department [of corrections; and];

F. "research institution" means the university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university or New Mexico institute of mining and technology; and

[E.] <u>G.</u> "survivor" means the spouse of the fire fighter or peace officer killed in the line of duty and any adopted or natural children twenty-one years of age or under at the time of [his] the fire fighter's or peace officer's death."

SECTION 2. Section 21-21F-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986, Chapter 50, Section 4) is amended to read:

"21-21F-4. ELIGIBILITY.--

<u>A.</u> A survivor meeting entrance requirements shall be entitled to a scholarship to the eligible institution of [<u>his</u>] <u>the survivor's</u> choice.

B. If the eligible institution is in New Mexico, .208695.4

<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete 1 the amount of the scholarship shall be equal to the amount of 2 tuition, room and board charged by the institution attended. 3 If the eligible institution is not in New Mexico, the amount of 4 the scholarship shall not exceed the average cost of attendance 5 at New Mexico research institutions.

6 The scholarship shall continue for such time as С. 7 the recipient remains a student in good standing at the 8 institution, but in no event shall any survivor receive a scholarship for more than [five] six years." 9 SECTION 3.
