of in-state tuition costs charged by: 1) research institutions
for each research institution; 2) comprehensive institutions
for each comprehensive institution; and 3) community colleges
for each community college, except that the uniform percentage
for a two-year state educational institution shall be based on
the uniform percentage for community colleges] an award for
each scholarship recipient distributed in amounts as follows:
1) one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) per scholarship
per program semester for a student enrolled at a research
institution; 2) one thousand twenty dollars (\$1,020) per
scholarship per program semester for a student enrolled at a
comprehensive institution; and 3) three hundred eighty dollars
(\$380) per scholarship per program semester for a student
enrolled at a community college.

- C. If the total amount available pursuant to

 Paragraph (1) of Subsection A of this section is less than the

 amount calculated in Subsection B of this section, the

 department shall decrease the scholarship award amounts in a

 manner that maintains the distribution in the same proportions

 as provided in Subparagraph (c) of Paragraph (3) of Subsection

 B of this section.
- D. If the total amount available pursuant to

 Paragraph (1) of Subsection A of this section is more than the

 amount calculated in Subsection B of this section, the

department shall increase the scholarship award amounts in a manner that maintains the distribution in the same proportions as provided in Subparagraph (c) of Paragraph (3) of Subsection B of this section."

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2018.

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
