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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:	
12	SECTION 1. SESSION EXPENSES	
13	A. There is appropriated from the general fund for	
14	the expense of the legislative department of the state of New	
15	Mexico for the second session of the fifty-third legislature	
16	for per diem and mileage of its members, for salaries of	
17	employees and for other expenses of the legislature, four	
18	million seven hundred twelve thousand dollars (\$4,712,000) or	
19	so much thereof as may be necessary for such purposes.	
20	B. The expenditures referred to in Subsection A of	
21	this section are as follows:	
22	(1) per diem for senators \$ 202,860;	
23	(2) per diem for members of the house of	
24	representatives\$ 338,100;

13	twenty-two dollars (\$395,722). No part of this item may be
14	transferred to salaries or employee benefits;
15	(8) for expense of the house of
16	representatives not itemized above, three hundred twenty-
17	seven thousand four hundred fifty dollars (\$327,450). No
18	part of this item may be transferred to salaries or employee
19	benefits; and
20	(9) for session expenses of the legislative
21	council service, the joint billroom and mailroom and joint
22	legislative switchboard, six hundred fifty-two thousand
23	dollars (\$652,000) to be disbursed upon vouchers signed by
24	the director of the legislative council service or the
25	director's designee.

C. The expenditures for the senate shall be 2 disbursed on vouchers signed by the chair of the committees' 3 committee and the chief clerk of the senate or the chief clerk's designee. The expenditures for the house of 4 representatives shall be disbursed on vouchers signed by the 5 speaker and chief clerk of the house or the chief clerk's 6 designee. Following adjournment of the session, expenditures authorized pursuant to Paragraphs (1) through (8) of 8 Subsection B of this section shall be disbursed upon vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee. 11

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Under the printing contracts entered into for 12 D. the second session of the fifty-third legislature, the chair 13 of the committees' committee of the senate, subject to the 14 15 approval of the committee, and the speaker of the house of representatives are authorized and directed to provide for 16 the printing of all bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, 17 memorials and joint memorials introduced in the senate or 18 house, the printing of the bill locator and the printing of 19 20 all necessary stationery required for use in the respective houses. They are further directed to provide for the 21 purchase of all supplies necessary for use in the respective 22 houses within the appropriation provided. The orders for 23 printing, stationery and supplies shall be approved by the 24 25 chair of the committees' committee in the senate or by the

speaker of the house.

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2 SECTION 2. BILLS AND OTHER PRINTED MATERIALS.--3 For the second session of the fifty-third Α. legislature, bills, resolutions, joint resolutions, memorials 4 5 and joint memorials delivered to the printer shall be returned by the printer to the joint billroom within forty-6 two hours after they are ordered to be printed. 7 The billroom personnel shall supply a complete file of bills, resolutions, 8 joint resolutions, memorials, joint memorials and other 9 10 printed distribution materials to the following: upon request, one copy to each member of 11 (1) the house of representatives and the senate; 12 (2) upon written request, one copy to each 13 county clerk, district judge, radio or television station and 14 15 newspaper and to the general library of each state-supported institution of higher learning; and 16 (3) upon written request, one copy to each 17 state department, commission, board, institution or agency, 18 each elected state official, each incorporated municipality, 19 20 each district attorney, each ex-governor, each member of the New Mexico congressional delegation and each public school 21 district in the state. 22 B. Any person not listed in Subsection A of this 23 section may secure a complete file of the bills, resolutions, 24

joint resolutions, memorials and joint memorials of the

1 legislature by depositing with the legislative council 2 service the amount of four hundred dollars (\$400), which 3 deposit shall be paid to the state treasurer to the credit of 4 the legislative expense fund. Additional single copies of 5 items of legislation shall be sold for two dollars (\$2.00) 6 unless the director of the legislative council service shall, because of its length, assign a higher price not to exceed 7 8 ten cents (\$.10) per page. Copies of a daily bill locator, 9 other than those copies furnished to each member of the 10 respective houses, shall be supplied by the legislative 11 council service at a charge of one hundred thirty-five dollars (\$135) for the entire session. 12

SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SERVICE.--There is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council service for fiscal year 2019, to be disbursed on vouchers signed by the director of the legislative council service or the director's designee, the following:

preparation, four hundred fifteen thousand dollars
(\$415,000);

C. for a statewide legislative intern program, forty-six thousand six hundred dollars (\$46,600);

D. for dues and fees of national organizations of which the legislature is a member, for fiscal years 2018 and 2019, three hundred sixty-one thousand seven hundred dollars (\$361,700);

E. for the legislative information system, for
fiscal years 2018 and 2019, eight hundred seventy-three
thousand four hundred dollars (\$873,400); and
