SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Memorial 69 requests the New Mexico State Transportation Commission to name a bridge located on interstate 40, exit 47, at the continental divide, after Jackson Gibson.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This memorial does not include an appropriation.

Pursuant to State Transportation Commission (STC) Policy No. 61, *Memorial or Honorary Designation or Dedication of Highways, Transportation Facilities and Structures*, the STC may take action to dedicate the subject bridge in memory of Jackson Gibson. If the STC takes such action, NMDOT would be responsible to bear the cost of production, installation and maintenance of the signs for the dedication made by the STC. The cost associated with production and installation of two signs to designate the subject bridge is approximately \$1 thousand.
