16	SECTION 1. Section 66-5-33.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1985,
17	Chapter 47, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"66-5-33.1. REINSTATEMENT OF DRIVER'S LICENSE OR
19	REGISTRATIONIGNITION INTERLOCKFEE
20	A. Whenever a driver's license or registration is
21	suspended or revoked and an application has been made for its
22	reinstatement, compliance with all appropriate provisions of
23	the Motor Vehicle Code and the payment of a fee of twenty-five
24	dollars (\$25.00) is a prerequisite to the reinstatement of any
25	license or registration.

If a driver's license was revoked for driving 2 while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, for 3 aggravated driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or pursuant to the Implied Consent Act, the 4 5 following are required to reinstate the driver's license: (1)an additional fee of seventy-five dollars 6 7 (\$75.00); 8 (2) completion of the license revocation 9 period; satisfaction of any court-ordered ignition 10 (3) interlock requirements; 11 12 (4) a minimum of six months of driving with an ignition interlock license with no attempts to circumvent, 13 14 remove or tamper with the ignition interlock device; evidence that the ignition interlock 15 (5) device has not recorded [two] any vehicle lockouts in the six 16 months prior to the application for reinstatement; and 17 evidence of verified active usage as that (6) 18 19 phrase is defined by the bureau. 20 C. A person whose driver's license reinstatement is denied may file an appeal pursuant to the provisions of Section 21 39-3-1.1 NMSA 1978. 22 D. 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1 minimum of six months, if the following conditions are met: 2 (1)the license revocation period is completed; 3 (2) satisfactory proof is presented to the 4 department that the person is no longer a resident of New 5 Mexico; and 6 7 (3) the license reinstatement fee is paid. Fees collected pursuant to Subsection B of this 8 Ε. 9 section are appropriated to the local governments road fund.
