10	A. The "media literacy advisory committee" is	
11	created. The media literacy advisory committee shall advise	
12	the public education department on media literacy in public	
13	schools.	
14	B. The secretary of public education shall appoint	
15	a maximum of fifteen members to the media literacy advisory	
16	committee. Members shall be culturally, geographically and	
17	politically diverse and may include:	
18	(1) a staff member from the public education	
19	department who works with educational technology and media	
20	literacy;	
21	(2) a curriculum and instruction	
22	representative from the public education department;	
23	(3) a public school student representative;	
24	(4) a public school teacher;

The chair of the media literacy advisory committee shall be elected by the committee. The committee 11 shall meet at the call of the chair. 12 Members of the media literacy advisory 13 D. committee are entitled to receive per diem and mileage as 14 15 provided in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no 16 other compensation, perquisite or allowance. Ε. The secretary of public education shall provide 17 staff support for the media literacy advisory committee in 18 the performance of its duties. 19 F. A simple majority of the media literacy 20 advisory committee members constitutes a quorum. A member of 21 the committee shall abstain from voting or the member's vote 22 shall be disqualified on any matter in which the member has a 23 pecuniary interest. 24 G. Members of the media literacy advisory 25

 September 1, 2020.

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H. The media literacy advisory committee shall meet at least four times before September 1, 2020. The committee shall comply with the provisions of the Open Meetings Act.

7 SECTION 2. TEMPORARY PROVISION--MEDIA LITERACY ADVISORY
 8 COMMITTEE AND PUBLIC EDUCATION DEPARTMENT DUTIES AND
 9 RESPONSIBILITIES.--

The media literacy advisory committee shall 10 Α. review the state kindergarten through twelfth grade learning 11 standards for educational technology that align with 12 definitions of media literacy, national standards and state 13 education standards in all subjects. The public education 14 15 department shall consult with the committee in reviewing the recommendations to change the state kindergarten through 16 twelfth grade learning standards for educational technology 17 that align with definitions of media literacy, national 18 standards and state education standards in all subjects. 19

B. The media literacy advisory committee shall
review rules and policies pertaining to media literacy,
including electronic resources and internet safety. The
public education department shall consult with the committee
when reviewing rules and policies pertaining to media
literacy, including electronic resources and internet safety. H

The media literacy advisory committee shall develop recommendations for professional development guidelines for teachers, including librarians, focused on integrating media literacy education across all grades and content areas. The public education department shall consult with the committee regarding the adoption of professional development guidelines that align with the department's standards and benchmarks.

D. The media literacy advisory committee shall 9 10 develop a survey for school administrators, teachers, librarians and educational technologists to determine how 11 media literacy education is integrated in public school 12 curricula. Upon approval of the committee's recommended 13 survey, the public education department shall conduct the 14 15 survey and use the survey information in consultation with the committee to determine how to increase access to media 16 literacy education across all grades and content areas in 17 public schools. 18

E. The public education department shall report to the legislative education study committee by September 1, 2020 on the department's and media literacy advisory committee's progress and deliver its final report to the governor and the legislative education study committee no later than November 1, 2020.

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F. As used in Sections 1 and 2 of this 2019 act,

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1	"media literacy" means the ability to access, analyze,
2	evaluate, create and communicate with media and digital
3	products.
4	SECTION 3. DELAYED REPEALSections 1 and 2 of this
