10	A person shall not be prosecuted, tried or punished in any

14	A. for a second degree felony, within six years	
15	from the time the crime was committed;	
16	B. for a third or fourth degree felony, within	
17	five years from the time the crime was committed;	
18	C. for a misdemeanor, within two years from the	
19	time the crime was committed;	
20	D. for a petty misdemeanor, within one year from	
21	the time the crime was committed;	
22	E. for any crime against or violation of Section	
23	51-1-38 NMSA 1978, within three years from the time the crime

7-1-72 or 7-1-73 NMSA 1978, within five years from the time the crime was committed; provided that for a series of crimes involving multiple filing periods within one calendar year, the limitation shall begin to run on December 31 of the year in which the crimes occurred;

G. for an identity theft crime pursuant to Section 30-16-24.1 NMSA 1978, within five years from the time the crime was discovered;

9 H. for any crime not contained in the Criminal
10 Code or where a limitation is not otherwise provided for,
11 within three years from the time the crime was committed;

I. for a capital felony or a first degree violent felony, no limitation period shall exist and prosecution for these crimes may commence at any time after the occurrence of the crime; and

J. for a crime against a child in violation of Section 30-9-11 NMSA 1978, prosecution for these crimes may commence at any time after the occurrence of the crime and until the alleged victim reaches the age of thirty years; provided that this subsection shall not apply to violent first degree felonies or to Paragraph (1) of Subsection G of Section 30-9-11 NMSA 1978."
