7	SECTION 1. Section 60-2F-15 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2009,

9	"60-2F-15. PERSONS PERMITTED TO CONDUCT BINGO		
10	GAMESPREMISES		
11	A. The officers of a bingo licensee shall		
12	designate a bingo manager to be in charge and primarily		
13	responsible for the conduct of all games of bingo. The bingo		
14	manager shall supervise all bingo activities on the occasion		
15	for which the bingo manager is in charge. The bingo manager		
16	shall be familiar with the provisions of the state laws, the		
17	rules of the board and the provisions of the bingo license.		
18	The bingo manager shall be present on the premises		
19	continuously during the bingo games and for a period of at		
20	least thirty minutes after the last bingo game.		
21	B. The bingo manager shall designate a game		
22	accountant to be primarily responsible for the proper		
23	preparation of the quarterly reports in accordance with the		
24	New Mexico Bingo and Raffle Act.		
25	C. For a bingo game, the bingo manager shall	SC Pa

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D. The premises where any game of chance is being held, operated or conducted or where it is intended that any equipment be used shall at all times be open to inspection by the board and its agents and employees and by peace officers of the state or any political subdivision of the state.

Ε. No owner or co-owner of the premises or, if a 8 corporation is the owner of the premises, any officer, 9 10 director or stockholder owning more than ten percent of the outstanding stock shall be designated as a bingo manager, a 11 game accountant or a bingo caller." 12

SECTION 2. A new Section 60-2F-15.1 NMSA 1978 is 13 enacted to read: 14

15 "60-2F-15.1. PERSONS PERMITTED TO CONDUCT PULL-TAB GAMES--PREMISES.--16

Only a veterans' or fraternal organization or a Α. 501(c)(3) organization that is a bingo licensee may operate 18 pull-tab dispensers when the organization is not concurrently 20 operating a bingo occasion.

Β. The bingo licensee shall designate a bingo 21 manager to be in charge and primarily responsible for the 22 conduct of all games of pull-tabs. The bingo manager shall 23 supervise all activities for which the bingo manager is in 24 charge. The bingo manager shall be familiar with the 25

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provisions of the state laws, the rules of the board and the provisions of the bingo license. The bingo manager need not be present on the premises continuously while a veterans' or fraternal organization or a 501(c)(3) organization that is a bingo licensee is operating pull-tab games.

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C. The bingo manager shall designate a game 6 accountant to be primarily responsible for the proper 7 preparation of the quarterly reports in accordance with the 8 New Mexico Bingo and Raffle Act. 9

10 D. The premises where any game of chance is being held, operated or conducted, or where it is intended that any 11 equipment be used, shall at all times be open to inspection 12 by the board and its agents and employees and by peace 13 officers of the state or any political subdivision of the 14 15 state.

16 Ε. No owner or co-owner of the premises or, if a corporation is the owner of the premises, any officer, 17 director or stockholder owning more than ten percent of the 18 outstanding stock, shall be designated as a bingo manager or 19 20 a game accountant.

F. Nothing in this section shall authorize a 21 veterans' or fraternal organization or a 501(c)(3) 22 organization to engage in class III gaming. 23

G. As used in this section, "501(c)(3) 24 organization" means an organization that demonstrates to the SCORC/SB 177 25
