SECTION 4. SECTION 10. NEW MEXICO SENTENCING COMMISSION.--Two hundred eighteen thousand five hundred dollars (\$218,500) is appropriated from the general fund to the New Mexico sentencing commission for expenditure in fiscal years 2019 and 2020 for crime reduction grants to support a criminal justice data-sharing network. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2020 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 11.
