SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 168 requires all corporations and domestic limited liability companies ("LLCs") to register, in addition to their corporate names, the names under which they propose to transact business in New Mexico, if different from their corporate names.

The effective date of SB 168 is July 1, 2019.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SOS notes that it receives inquiries on a daily basis from entities wishing to include a "doing business as" name to their official business registrations, but that state law currently provides only for a foreign LLC to register a "doing business as" name.
