SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 174 allows persons 75 years of age or older to seek exemption from jury service without having to obtain an affidavit. Jurors who are summonsed and 75 years or older are required to submit an affidavit of proof of age to be excused from jury service. SB174 is recommending to remove the affidavit as a requirement for excusals.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be a minimal administrative cost for statewide update, distribution and documentation of statutory changes. The minimal costs are likely to be offset by minimal savings in an increase of exempted jurors who will no longer receive pay.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Enacting SB174 would:

- Reduce the amount of paperwork required.
- Allow participants to request by phone, email, online, mail, etc., to be excused,

without a notarized form.

• Allow courts to verify age using the courts statewide Jury Management system, or other means, and not require the wait time or added step of a notarized from.

The Public Defender Department notes that "one constitutional issue could be that exempting persons over seventy-five might deny a person, particularly a person over seventy-five, of a jury of his or her peers. However, SB 174 does not add this provision; it only decreases the requirements for requesting such an exemption."
