### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 351 appropriates \$200 thousand from the general fund to the Aging and Long-Term Services Department for expenditure in FY20 to create a statewide network of services and supports to grandparents raising grandchildren, including general support services, parent training, support groups, case management, social activities and enrichment activities for children.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$200 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY20 shall revert to the general fund.
