Senate Bill 386 amends section 12-3-4 NMSA 1978 to adopt the wedding dance, “La Marcha de Los Novios”, as the state dance of the state of New Mexico.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal implications.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Thirty states have official state dances, 23 of which are the square dance. Oregon was the first state to adopt an official state dance, the square dance, in 1977. Delaware most recently adopted the maypole dance as the official dance in 2016.

WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

New Mexico will not have an official state dance.
