11	REQUESTING THE CREATION OF A CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION TASK
12	FORCE TO DEVELOP RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SUSTAINABLE FUNDING OF
13	CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS ALIGNED TO WORKFORCE NEEDS
14	AND TO PROVIDE A REPORT ON THE STATUS OF FUNDING CAREER
15	TECHNICAL EDUCATION IN NEW MEXICO.

17	WHEREAS, education provides the foundation for students to
18	enter and succeed in their chosen fields of employment; and
19	WHEREAS, all students need employability skills and
20	knowledge to meet standards that have been identified for each
21	career pathway; and
22	WHEREAS, career technical education classes of all kinds
23	are increasingly seen as roads to additional study after high
24	school and are meant to be more academically rigorous; and
25	WHEREAS, new labor market realities reflect a shifting,

WHEREAS, career technical education prepares students for the world of work by introducing them to workplace competencies and makes academic content accessible by providing hands-on experiences in various industry sectors; and

WHEREAS, developing high-quality career technical 8 9 education programs requires expertise in career fields, knowledge of the academic content foundations of career 10 decisions, employability skills aligned to workforce 11 12 employment, post-secondary requirements for credentials and degrees, opportunities for work-related experiences and 13 14 apprenticeships and partnerships with local employers and post-secondary educational institutions; and 15

WHEREAS, public schools have indicated a desire to develop career technical education programs to increase education options for their students but lack funding to develop and implement programs that meet the needs of their students and the local or regional labor market; and

WHEREAS, funding for career technical education programs requires equipment and often specialized student work areas; and

WHEREAS, developing career technical education programs requires a multi-year commitment from schools and school 216698.1

districts to adequately prepare students to complete their programs, earn a credential, certification or degree and find employment; and

WHEREAS, funding for career technical education has been limited and not available statewide, creating inequities; and

WHEREAS, high-quality career technical education programs have been shown to increase graduation rates and contribute to improved academic achievement;

9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
10 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the legislative education study
11 committee and the legislative finance committee be requested to
12 convene a career technical education task force to examine the
13 funding requirements of developing career technical education
14 programs statewide and to provide a report on the status of
15 career technical education in New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the public education department be requested to assist the career technical education task force and include as members representatives who have technical knowledge of, and expertise in, career technical education, including the following:

A. six members who are middle and high school teachers engaged in career technical education;

B. four members who are school principals, superintendents, school board members or other education administrators familiar with career technical education; 216698.1
