SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 195 (SB195) appropriates \$250 thousand from the general fund to the Department of Transportation for the purpose of implementing teen driver safety training to better recognize, understand, and navigate work zones, vehicle trouble on roadsides, and move-over laws.

There is no effective date of this bill. It is assumed that the effective date is 90 days following adjournment of the Legislature.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation of \$250 thousand contained in this bill is a recurring expense to general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2022 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

DOT notes that if a request for proposal process is utilized “to identify a vendor to provide the expanded training in driver education, the \$250 thousand funding may need to be available for at least a 2-year period.”
