14	WHEREAS, the American public for the twenty-first
15	consecutive year has ranked nurses number one in Gallup's
16	annual poll as the most honest and ethical profession; and
17	WHEREAS, nursing is one of the fastest growing occupations
18	in the United States and serves as the backbone of the health
19	care delivery system; and
20	WHEREAS, nursing as a career provides economic stability
21	for individuals and their families and has positive economic
22	impacts for communities; and
23	WHEREAS, the 2022 New Mexico health care workforce
24	committee report to the legislature estimated that only sixteen
25	thousand four hundred sixty-six registered nurses holding New

Mexico nursing licenses were practicing in the state; and

WHEREAS, the same report estimates that despite positive growth, an additional five thousand eight hundred sixty-three registered nurses are needed for New Mexico to begin to meet national benchmarks to ensure quality care; and

WHEREAS, nurses serve New Mexico's population across many settings, including community and private health clinics, home care and hospice, schools, nursing facilities, employee health, corrections, research, academia and hospitals; and

WHEREAS, the legislature has supported funding for New Mexico's educational institutions to begin to build the capacity of nursing programs to increase New Mexico's supply of registered nurses; and

WHEREAS, the board of nursing has approved sixteen pre-licensure programs for nursing that ensure geographic diversity for recruitment of students into the nursing profession; and

WHEREAS, the growing number of seriously ill patients creates a demand for more nurses who can provide complex and specialized care; and

WHEREAS, today, more than two hundred student nurses from New Mexico are visiting the state capitol;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that February 2, 2023 be declared "New Mexico Student Nurses Day" in the senate in honor of all New Mexico .224470.1 - 2 -
