BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Making appropriations from The Public Project Revolving Fund to The Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund, Local Government Planning Fund and Cultural Affairs Facilities Infrastructure Fund.

Section 1(A)(3) allocates five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to the cultural affairs facilities infrastructure fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2025 and subsequent fiscal years to carry out the purposes of the fund.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The Cultural Affairs Infrastructure Fund provides critical funding to support proper stewardship of cultural resources within the Cultural Affairs Department (CAD). CAD has received funds from the Public Project Revolving Fund (PPRF) for the past 4 years. This would be the 5th year receiving funds from the PPRF. The Cultural Affairs Department (CAD) utilizes these funds to carry out much needed infrastructure projects, repairs at our statewide facilities, and respond to emergency repairs. CAD relies on these funds to supplement other capital appropriations.

The NMFA Act provides that up to 35% of the prior year's GGRT may be appropriated to one of seven funds, administered by three different agencies, including the Cultural Affairs Facilities Infrastructure Fund, administered by the Cultural Affairs Department. The total amount falls within the parameters set in the law.
