BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: House Bill 52 allocates \$100,000 from the General Fund to Sandoval County in FY25 for domestic violence training.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS – none identified.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

HB 52 allocates one-time funding in FY25 for Sandoval County to train law enforcement officers, probation and parole officers, court personnel and victim advocates on domestic violence. Other than mentioning “domestic violence training” this legislation does not describe the content, frequency or extent of the training or which department/agency with the county would conducting the training.

The Sandoval County Coordinated Community Response team is a multidisciplinary group that meets monthly to address domestic violence issues. This group includes law enforcement, advocates and community stakeholders. This funding may duplicate or overlap with the intended purpose of this legislation.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS – none identified.

CONFLICT, DUPLICATION, COMPANIONSHIP, RELATIONSHIP – none identified.

TECHNICAL ISSUES – none identified.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES – The judiciary already provides training for judges, hearing officers and court clerks on domestic violence. Including “court personnel” in this list of individuals to be trained would duplicate existing judicial training opportunities and may actually contradict existing court rules and procedures.
